COACH'S CORNER

We have our 2022 meet schedule locked in and our events page will have all of the information needed to successfully sign-up for a meet. The coaching staff is available to work with you and your swimmers in order to pick the right events for any of the meets on our schedule. We typically focus on events that have been covered in our curriculum, but we also want to have our swimmers experience racing out of their comfort zone too so there will be times they might swim an event they haven't quite mastered the basics. Disqualifications are all part of learning how to race. DQs happen all the time and at all levels of competitions.

The deadline to submit entries for the 1-day Shasta Y Sharks meet is **Wednesday**, **December 8th**. Have your swimmer check-in with their coach if they're interested in swimming. All swimmers are recommended to attend the meet, even if you've just joined the team.
