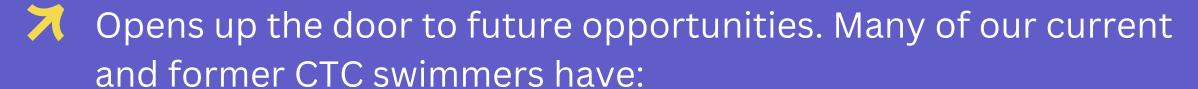

Why should I join the swim team?

- > Help your kids learn to be strong swimmers.
- Be part of a close knit community within the CTC. There is no better place to get to know your neighbors!





- Continued swimming throughout the year and received scholarships to swim in college.
- Earned a substantial amount of Student Service Learning hours required for high school graduation by serving as Junior Coaches.
- Have been hired as lifeguards at our own CTC pool and other pools in the area. Our very own pool manager is a former Tiger Shark!
- Have been offered jobs as swim instructors.
- Have returned to coach the Tiger Sharks!
- \nearrow Break up the summer slump. Being a part of the team gets the kids active every day.
- Provides the kids a chance to interact with peers in the neighborhood. These friendships last well into middle and high school!

Background Information

- Tiger Sharks are in the Montgomery County Swim League (MCSL) division O.
- The team is open to CTC residents ages 5 18.

 Non-residents who were on the team last year and pay the pool membership fee are also able to join.
- Prior swim team experience is not necessary, but swimmers need to meet the following guidelines for their age group:
 - 15-18 must be able to swim **50 meters of freestyle and 50 meters of backstroke** without stopping.
 - 13-14 must be able to swim 50 meters of freestyle and 50 meters of backstroke without stopping.
 - 11-12 must be able to swim 50 meters of freestyle and 25 meters of backstroke without stopping
 - 9-11 must be able to swim 50 meters of freestyle and 25 meters of backstroke without stopping.
 - 8 & under must be able to swim 25 meters of freestyle and 25 meters of backstroke without stopping.

Registration

Registration is done via the team <u>webpage</u>

Registration fee is \$175 per swimmer. The fee covers all practices, regular meets, team t-shirt and spirit events at the pool. Payment is accepted via credit or debit card only.

Swim Meets



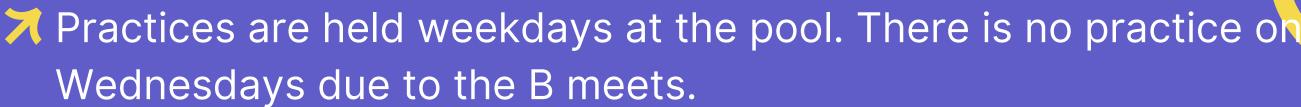
- There are 5 "A" meets and 5 "B" meets per season.
- ➢ B meets are on a weekday, usually Wednesday evenings. "A" meets are on Saturday or Sunday.
- We will have 4 home meets and 4 away meets. All meets are in Montgomery County.
- There is a weekly theme at every meet. The themes make the meets festive and build up team spirit. This season's themes are:
 - Dress like a granddad or someone dear
 - Superhero
 - Red, white, & blue
 - Jungle safari
 - Favorite decade







Swim Practice



- Practices are at 5, 6, or 7 pm in the evening, depending on the age group.
- For children under 13, swimmers must be in the care of responsible adults at all times while at the pool. Children ages 13-15 must have a parent sign a Parental Authorization form for them to be at practice unattended.
- If the pool is open, practices and meets will continue as scheduled. In the case of bad weather, the pool manager is the one responsible for making the decision to close the pool. Sign up for text and email alerts through your account on Team Unify. There are instructions on the webpage.



Team Events

- > Spirit Nights
 - Occur on Friday nights to get team pumped for the meets.
 - Float nights, movie nights, fire pit, etc.
- Meet and greets prior to the start of the season











Parent Volunteers

The CTC Tiger Sharks is a parent-run organization. We depend upon parent volunteers to run the team and perform the many required roles during the meets.

Each family is required to fulfill a certain number of volunteer hours. There are many jobs that need to be filled to run a swim meet. Families who do

not meet the volunteer requirement will be assessed a \$250 fee

at the end of the season.



Volunteer Activities

Examples of volunteer jobs at the meets:

- Working at the concession stand
- Timing the events
- Setting up the pool deck
- Entering times into the computer system
- Walking the timer papers from the lanes to the computer operators
- Lining up the kids for the events during the meet



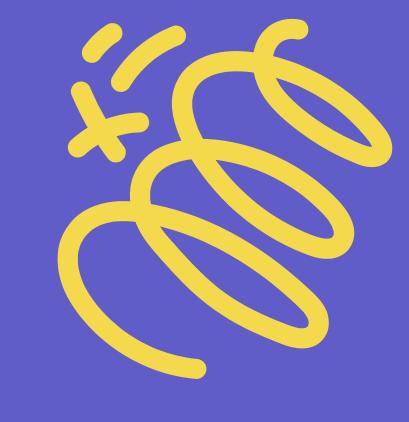
Trained Officials

Every team needs to have trained officials to help run the meets.

Required Officials

- Stroke and Turn judge
- Referee
- Advanced Referee
- Starter

Training dates are in May/June. Volunteers will be credited for time spent in training. Our team desperately needs trained officials to help run the meets. Without them, there is no team! More trained officials = less work





for everyone. A 15% discount is offered to parents who commit to being an official.
