Falcon Student-Athlete Code of Conduct

The coaching staff and administration at College Park High School are committed to building sports programs that are recognized and respected. We want our student-athletes to be proud members of the Falcon Family now and in the future. Accountability, integrity, discipline and character development are the foundation of this commitment. We will not sacrifice any aspect of our program for any individual(s).

For this reason all Falcon Athletes are expected to adhere to the following code of conduct. Violation of any aspect of this code may result in disciplinary action up to and including suspension or dismissal from the team. Falcon Student-Athletes:
will respect their health and well being. The use, possession, sale or being under the influence of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, vaping products or related materials is strictly prohibited.
will make responsible decisions and refrain from committing local, state or federal crimes.
will display responsible use of the internet, social media and online communications. This includes all posts, videos, pictures, texts and emails. Inappropriate material or posts not supportive of the team will not be tolerated.
will make their commitment to the program a priority. (We understand that family, faith, friends, and academics are also priorities). The team and program must be included among these priorities. SWIMMERS MUST MAINTAIN A MINIMUM OF 85% IN ATTENDANCE THOUGHOUT THE SEASON.
will give their best effort to attend all practices because the team is a priority. If an athlete must miss a practice they should contact the coaching staff personally for clearance before missing practice.
will be on time and prepared for all practices and events. If the athlete will be late for a scheduled practice/event they should contact the coaching staff personally for clearance prior to the event. ARRIVE AT GATE 10 MINUTES PRIOR TO PRACTICE START TIME.
are accountable for their injury recovery. Athletes will inform the coaching staff personally when attending sports medicine for treatment and update coaches of their progress. SPORTS MEDICINE DOES NOT PERSCIBE PRACTICE, IF INJURY PERSISTS, ATHLETE MUST VISIT DOCTOR AND RETURN WITH A CLEARANCE. will treat all officials, opponents and spectators with respect regardless of the situation.
will show respect to all members of the College Park coaching staff and in return expect to receive reciprocal treatment.
will treat all teachers and district personnel with respect.
will treat all team members with respect. Any form or "hazing" is strictly prohibited.

- 3. If behavior continues, Athletic Director will notify the swimmer and parent and will be asked to leave the team.
