

Dear Members,

We are now heading into the peak of our summer golf season. I'd like to thank everyone involved in the planning and execution of this year's Rocket Mortgage Classic. Truly a unique experience for everyone involved, it will be one more feather in the cap for the long history of this premier Club. I especially want to recognize the efforts of the grounds maintenance crew, led by Jake Mendoza. Last year I thought conditions were superb, this year the condition appear absolutely fantastic. I look forward to learning the thoughts of the players and PGA officials. Most importantly though, is that there are outstanding conditions for the golfing members to enjoy on a daily basis.

For golfers, it has been a busy a busy first half of the year. Rounds played this year through June compared to rounds played last year through June are up considerably. Financially, we have experienced a large slide in the food and beverage revenues due to the Michigan executive order restrictions. On the flip side, the member carts and guest fees have been considerably better than budget his year. As long as the weather stays good and executive orders regarding food and beverage options don't become more restrictive, our fiscal year should finish in a position better than predicted in March and April but certainly less than our original fiscal year budget.

As we continue in this "new normal", it is critical we respect the safety and health of others and ourselves. Aside from social distancing, you'll notice staff wearing face masks in the Clubhouse, and gloves being worn in food and beverage areas. We've added signage to serve as reminders for everyone, and posted floor markings in high foot traffic service areas. Plexiglas shields have been added in various clubhouse areas as well as the Stand. We've taken additional measures as well, and ask that everyone entering the clubhouse do their part. Wear a mask when walking in the clubhouse.

The reservation system put in place at the pool has been working well. Thank you to everyone who has become familiar with the system and the process. The online reservation system has been updated to help improve the user experience and provide a consistent look within the website and app. We are also in the process of creating a dining reservation system that will be very similar to the pool reservation system.

Construction on the KCE (Kahn Clubhouse Experience) project was moving along very well once construction restrictions were lifted. Great progress was made to the patio and fire pit areas, and the beautiful Donald Ross statue is in place. Inside, the Ross Grille has drywall installed with woodwork installation to begin late in the first week of July 6. Construction was stopped during the Rocket Mortgage Classic event, and will resume full activity on Monday, July 6. Nearly all furniture and fixtures needed for completion of the project is on property or stored off site, waiting for installation. As completion of the project gets closer, we will provide additional communications.

Detroit Golf Club continues to be an attractive Club for prospective members. There has been a strong and steady number of new members each month this spring and summer. For July, membership totals are slightly less than our original budget, and significantly above 2019 numbers for the same month. I anticipate August, the final month of our fiscal year, to also be a strong month for welcoming new members. This will place us in a solid position for the start of a new fiscal year. Our Tuesday men's league and Wednesday Girls Night Out resume July 7 and 8, respectively. The food and beverage management team is planning themed dining options for each week. The addition of the Stand as a location for food and beverage during league play worked well as the league play began. Food and beverage service for the league activity will continue there and the Sundial/Crystal room as we continue to use those clubhouse spaces as our restaurant. Once the KCE project is complete, we will move the dining activity to those newly remodeled spaces.

My quote this month comes from Steve Jobs: "We don't get a chance to do that many things, and every one should be really excellent. Because this is our life."

I look forward to seeing everyone soon at the Club.

My dear Mr. Peet:

I have seen the letter, addressed to the Board of Directors of the Detroit Golf Club, by Mr. Noack, concerning a most regrettable incident which occurred on the South Course Sunday afternoon, October 30th, 1927. I am sending this to the Board after reading this letter referred to you, with instructions to take the letter up with me.

In answer to Mr. Noack's letter, I wish first to point out some inaccuracies in Mr. Noack's letter as follows:

1. In reference to as he states above Noack, Noack refers to as as a "solo" shot (see above). I do not agree with the club will tell you that he did nothing but that.

2. He writes that the ball which struck me was "a clear hole shot at times". Mr. A. L. Noack and Mr. F. D. Peet, the two players about whom will hear me out in this statement. From the first hole to the eighteenth, their ball and a hole in which we were not held up by them, with the possible exception of hole 14.

3. He claims that the ball which struck me was 100' or more away, or even 1 or 2 rods to the left of his drive, and will have the first basket, I was still 20 or more yards from the green. This is a 100' yard hole. It doesn't require a course, in either direction, to determine the distance the ball had travelled when it hit me.

4. He is especially sorry for my hasty action on that Sunday afternoon. I am glad now to apologize for it. My fit of rage at that moment was instantaneous; and, as one received 10 more than 1, it was a necessary lesson from the rules of good sportsmanship. I have always tried to maintain. I wish now that I could wish it more.

5. He admits to you, and as we converse, but as a reason that I had been annoyed beyond the bounds of patience.

Mr. Jefferson S. Peet

I have played golf several years, when we began sometimes golfers, and never before have I been tempted to drive another man's ball off the course. That I should do so on that Sunday afternoon, evidently not without cause, is not remarkable to me.

It is my understanding that the regulation covering Sunday golf is that the club has the right to close over Saturday, preventing the members from having the course, which at 1927 were so long, I was not present. I read Mr. Noack's letter that the committee say for a reason to prevent the right of golf through a provision in regularly in driving distance of the green, and, regardless of the distance this article, The very long as to the distance of the drive, and situation as I mention to above. This was at no time done. The rounds will show that the South course was opened on this particular afternoon. That date there was announced at the tee, where we waited necessarily for the players ahead to get out of their way before we drove.

This I would to you would be good practice for Mr. Peet to sing in the future. We were driven into not one, but many times during last afternoon. On the ninth hole we were stopped three times by other drivers, and all three were dangerously close to the green. "Toss" you will, and not a pleasant thought to me that the person of wife and friends are to be endangered while playing golf by such courtesy as Mr. Peet displayed towards as that afternoon, and when Mr. Noack's ball struck us on the subterfuge fairly I did like control of myself and caused it from the course. Even in my anger I thought enough of him not to knock it back in his direction. Had Mr. Peet in his impatience been as thoughtful of us this regrettable incident would never have occurred.

For my son's sake I am exceedingly sorry, but may I also suggest to Mr. Peet that those who are not members on the golf course must have some of it in stock themselves to offer in exchange.

The players ahead of us will hear me out in my statement, that during the entire round there was not a hole in which we were not held up by them, and that long before this

Dear Members,

I hope that everyone had the opportunity to watch the Rocket Mortgage Classic on television last weekend! The golf course and staff exceeded my expectations for the event. We were able to produce firm, fast, and healthy conditions, using primarily our in-house staff! This was a very unique experience with no spectators, limited volunteers, and extra protocols in place to keep everyone safe.

The rough was long, fairways and greens were firm and fast, and most importantly we came out of the event with very healthy turf. Yes, there are some areas that are off color, but these areas will bounce back quickly. One of the main reasons that I feel confident in the turf bouncing back quickly is the quality of root density and depth that we have right now. As you can see in the picture below root depth is approximately 4 to 5 inches, and has excellent density.



One of the most important ways to improve rooting is through aerification. The picture to the left shows green, healthy turf in this spring's aerification holes, with dry, dormant turf around the holes. This turf is just dormant, not dead. With regular watering and some cooler temperatures, it will bounce back! Most of the dormant turf is Poa Annua, over time we can use stress periods like this to promote Bent Grass encroachment into the Poa. We will take advantage of the summer heat and interseed Bent Grass into these areas. With continued aerification, careful water management, and patience we can slowly reduce our Poa population.

The build out for this year's event was smaller, and there were no spectators, but there was still a lot of traffic on the golf courses. Volunteers, PGA Officials, TV personnel, tournament officials and

maintenance all added to the wear and tear on the golf courses. There are some rough areas that will need to be repaired due to cart traffic. There are also some green, tee and fairway areas that will need a little extra attention in the coming weeks. These areas were stressed due to mowing repetitions, high temperatures and dry weather.

As you get back on the course please be patient as we return to normal golf conditions. We have prioritized our recovery efforts to all in play areas first. Areas such as tree lines and the PGA Driving Range tees will be addressed once all other areas are completed. This will be a much quicker process than last year but will take some time.



During the event, staff safety was at the forefront of everything that we did. Our volunteer pool was reduced to 13 volunteers. These volunteers only worked our morning shift, which was 3:30 am to 7 am. We kept the volunteers and staff on the same jobs, with the same equipment all week. This allowed us to thoroughly sanitize all equipment, limit morning meetings and keep all social distancing protocols in place. All of the mid-day and evening tasks were completed by DGC staff, which means we had to get creative in our scheduling. The DGC staff worked 3:30 am to 8 pm every day of tournament week. There was a lot of multitasking and completing jobs with fewer staff! The days were long and hot, but the staff did an amazing job executing! I could not be more proud of them!

As the summer progresses, I look forward to seeing all of you and your families and making the most of our time together at DGC.


