About the Dolphins

This is a fun-filled, competitive swim team open to boys and girls who have achieved at least a beginner level of swimming. The program is designed to bring out the

best in each swimmer!

Our Summer Swim Team program promotes physical health, positive self-esteem, dedication, and teamwork. On the Dolphins, our desire is to help each child develop their swimming skills in a safe and caring environment while having fun!

Eligibility Requirements

In order to participate in the 2024 Dolphins Swim Team, participants must be members of good standing of Ashbourne Swim Club. All participants must be able to swim at least 25 meters on their stomach or back. Swimmers who are 18 years of age or younger on June 1, 2024 are eligible to participate this season. Swimmers must be officially registered prior to participating in their first meet. All dues must be paid by June 14th.

Each swimmer must be eligible to compete in the North Brandywine Swim League (NBSL) and affirm this by completing a 2024 NBSL Eligibility form. If your swimmer is a returning swimmer from last season, they do not need to complete the eligibility form this season. This form is located in Swimmingly and will be available to sign during registration.

What are Mini Dolphins?

Mini Dolphins is for our new to swimming children who are 8 and under or returning swimmers who may not yet be able to swim 25 meters independently. Swim team coaches will work with the kids to develop increased comfort and stamina in the water. Coaches will focus on teaching freestyle, with the goal of getting the kids to swim a full 25 meters without help. If a child attains that goal within the swim season, they will be invited to join the full team.

In addition to the swim practices, children in the Mini Dolphins Pre-Team will be able to participate in the swim team events and will receive a team gift. They will also be able to participate in an end of season "fun meet" to show off the skills they have developed throughout the season.

Mini Dolphins Practices:

- 10:00-10:30 a.m Wednesdays and Fridays
- June 19 July 12 (no practice on July 4).

Cost for Mini Dolphins:

The cost for the Mini Dolphins Pre-Team will be \$100 per swimmer. If your child transitions to the main team they will need to be registered through Swimmingly and pay the \$15 registration fee. The Mini Dolphin fee provides participation with all of the regular team events, activities, including swim cap and end of year team gift.

Home Meets

Please arrive at Ashbourne Swim Club by 4:30pm. Warmups start at 5:00pm and the meet will start at 6:00pm. Our Dolphin Diner will be open and selling a variety of foods throughout the meet. We encourage all swimmers to stay to the end of the meets to cheer on teammates.

Away Meets

Please arrive at the away pool by 5:00pm. Warmups start at 5:30pm. The meet starts at 6:00pm. Procedures for away meets may depend on the pool. Specific information regarding each away meet will be communicated through e-mail, facebook, and the team app the day before the meet.

RSVPing for Swim Meets (Meet declarations)

Swimmers are required to RSVP for dual meets by 12pm noon the day before the meet in Swimmingly. This gives the coaches enough time to write a balanced lineup. Coaches have many factors to consider and will write lineups that best benefit the team, improve times, and allow swimmers to get qualifying times for end of season meets.

RSVPs will be done through Swimmingly as they were last season (**see** page 9 for instructions).

If your attendance status changes after the RSVP deadline has passed, please email **Ashbournedolphins@gmail.com** and please reach out to the coaches directly. If your swimmer is running late to a meet, please use the Game Changer app to alert coaches of the delay ASAP. Failure to do so may result in us scratching your swimmer from the meet.

End of Season Meets

There are two end of season meets: the Invitational Meet which has a qualifying time, and the Classics Meet which all swimmers are welcome to participate in. All 7 to 18 year olds can participate in the Classics Meet regardless of qualifying times. Time Trial times do not count. Qualifying times for the Invitational Meet will be shared closer to the season and can be found on the NBSL website. As a team we seek to celebrate all of those who secure a qualifying time and encourage those who are still chasing qualifying times! Coach Brendan will have a banner swimmers can sign when they make a time!

Team Buddies

All swimmers will be assigned a buddy for the season. This informal program pairs older swimmers with younger swimmers to foster friendships, make new swimmers more comfortable, improves team spirit, and gets swimmers more involved with their teammates.

Each swim meet, buddies should cheer for each other's races and can exchange small gifts (*spending no more than \$5 per meet*). Buddies will be assigned in the first weeks of practice. Any questions contact Rebecca or Alison.

Parent Volunteer Responsibilities

It is essential that *all* Swim Team parents fill volunteer roles during the regular season and at the Championship meets. We can not run successful meets without everyone's help! At a home meet we need roughly 40 volunteers! All sign-ups will take place in signupgenius.com.

Dual meet volunteering policy and fee

- \$250/family check to be held by team treasurer
- Families commit to volunteer at 5 meets and events
- Any person 16 or older may volunteer 'for your family'
- If volunteer requirements are not met, checks will be cashed to pay for others to fill your place.

Parent Volunteer Opportunities

Even if you have never worked at a swim meet, we are happy to work with you to help you learn any of the positions below. These are essential positions to ensure our dual meets are able to happen.

Head Timer (2 per meet)	Takes charge of lane timers and also serves as a backup timer in case someone misses the start or there is a technical malfunction.
Scorer (2 per meet)	Follow along the Swimmingly app, correct any errors, add DQ's, and finalize score of the meet.
Lane Timer (first ½ or second ½ of meet) '12 people per meet	Stands with their smartphone with the Swimmingly app in a lane and times each swimmer in that lane. A timer from the opposing team will time each swimmer as well. Timers enter a swimmer's 3-digit code and times are automatically sent to the scorekeeper.
Place Judge *2 per meet	Visually determines where each swimmer places in each race (i.e. 1 st , 2 nd , 3 rd , etc.) and fills it out on a notepad. In the event of a discrepancy, the place judge's decision trumps the timer's decision. <i>Looking to train several people in this role.</i>
Announcer (1 per meet = 2 meet volunteer spots)	Announces each event and names of the swimmers in each event to the spectators over the loudspeaker. Announces anything else that the coaches or reps may indicate (home meets only). We are looking to train someone in this job who would be available for all of our home meets during a season!!
Starter (1 per meet = 2 meet volunteer spots)	Using their smartphone with the Swimmingly app, announces each event to the swimmers, calls the swimmers up to the blocks, makes sure timers are ready and presses the start button (home meets only). We are looking to train someone in this job who would be available for all of our home meets during a season!!
Stroke & Turn Judge *2 per meet	Determines legality of strokes and turns and marks them on their smartphone with the Swimmingly app (Must be able to attend the NBSL provided training session for this role). A knowledge of strokes and turns is a must.
Age Group Swimmer Herder (**6 people whole meet counts as 1 event)	Gets to know the swimmers in their respective age groups. During meets, helps to gather those swimmers and lines them up for their events. One parent for each age group is needed for the 6 & Under through 10 & Under age groups. "It is preferable that age group parents commit to help the entire season.
Dolphin Diner Shifts (6-8 people per meet)	Assists the Dolphin Diner Coordinators in selling items during the meet and cleaning up at the conclusion of the meet. Assistants will still be able to see their swimmers swim!
Ribbon Writer (2 per meet - 2nd half only)	As the results from each event come in, ribbon writers will attach printed labels to the appropriate ribbon and then sort them by team and last name. Ribbon writers from the opposing team will be present to complete their own team's ribbons. This may also be a 'day-after the meet' job.
Set Up and Clean Up (4 per meet)	Set up help would arrive at 4 p.m for Home Meets to help set up our Dolphin Cafe, Scorers Table, and any other things the Coach may need help with. Set up time 4 - 6 p.m Clean up help needed at the end of the meet for 2 hours, helping tear down Dolphin Diner, Scorer Table, clean up grounds and prepare the pool for the next morning. Clean up time: 1 hour before end of meet until work is done. Usually by 30 min after the meet is over.

Team Uniform

- Purchase a black suit from your outlet of choice
- The Swim Shop at Fairfax Shopping Center can place our team logo on a suit **must purchase the suit from them** *Tell them you are with Ashbourne*
- Swimmers are encouraged to wear the black team suit but it is not required.
- All fittings and payments go through The Swim Shop.
- Strongly suggested: 2 pairs of goggles for meets
- Team will provide latex swim caps
- Order a personalized silicone swim cap through The Swim Shop. *Tell them you are with Ashbourne.*

Swimmingly App

NBSL is using Swimmingly to run swim meets again this year. After registering their swimmers for the team, parents will RSVP for every meet for their swimmers to ensure an accurate lineup.

- Push notifications when your swimmers event is near
- Check your swimmers times
- Check the lineup in real time
- Volunteers use app on their smartphones to streamline meets
- Starter syncs all stopwatches automatically to the start of the race with the app
- Timers automatically send their times to the scorer
- Stroke and Turn judges automatically send disqualifications to the scorer
- Staging area helpers can view meet lineup in real time

These procedures will be practiced at the Parent's Meeting and Time Trials for any new families to the team.

Swimmer Registration on the Swimmingly App

Parents/Guardians, once you register & sign-up your swimmer(s) using the instructions below, they'll automatically populate on the roster and become active for the season! Per the Swimmingly Child Protection Policy, as a guardian, you will have oversight of your swimmer(s) and can invite other parents/guardians/grandparents that you wish to affiliate with your swimmers in the Swimmingly Clubhouse!

Meet Declarations/RSVP

- 1. Log into your Parent account in the **Swimmingly Clubhouse**.
- 2. Click on the Meet Schedule tab.
- 3. If you do not see the Meet Schedule tab, you will first need to select your club name.
- 4. Select the meet that you wish to declare your swimmers for.
- 5. If you see "Meet Declarations (pending)" that means that we have not yet opened up meet declarations for the swim meet.
- 6. Declare your swimmers as "attending" or "not attending."
- 7. If your Club Admin has allowed parents to enter their swimmers for individual events (like Championships), you will also have the option to select the events you want your swimmer(s) to compete in. Any declarations will be saved in real-time as soon as you take action here.
- 8. That's it! Your coach will now be able to view your meet declarations for the upcoming swim meet.

We look forward to seeing all our returning Dolphins and welcoming our new Dolphins to the team in May!!

NBSL Code of Conduct

The purpose of the North Brandywine Swim League Code of Conduct is to establish standards of conduct that our swimmers, officials and parents are expected to uphold while participating in sanctioned swim meets of the NBSL. It is the goal of the NBSL that these standards of conduct be incorporated into the daily management of the teams within the league. Any individual with a complaint should be directed to the NBSL representative or designee who will take the complaint to the meet referee if warranted.

- 1. All participating teams will abide by this code of conduct.
- 2. Disrespectful, indiscreet or destructive behavior at a swim meet will not be tolerated.
- 3. No team personnel, competitor or spectator shall act in an unsportsmanlike manner. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - a. Making insulting or derogatory remarks, gestures or acts, including taunting.
 - b. Trying to influence or showing disgust with the officials' decisions.
 - c. Using obscene language.
 - d. Vandalizing property.
 - e. Physical Abuse, defined as any unwanted physical contact including but not limited to, shoving or striking a person before, during, or after a meet.
- 4. The use of tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, or drugs other than those prescribed by a physician, is not permitted within the pool deck area prior to, during, or after the meets.
- 5. No individual shall direct the modification of disqualification cards following the final approval by the meet referee.
- 6. No individual shall modify the ribbons or medals awarded to swimmers at NBSL Classic or Invitational Meets.
- 7. Each team shall maintain orderly conduct at all times, including after-meet celebrations.
- 8. No team personnel/competitor shall enter the water without the referee's approval.
- 9. The reporting of a violation to these codes of conduct will be through the team's NBSL representative or designee, to the meet referee, and written documentation will be presented to the NBSL Executive Committee

within 24 hours.

10. If an individual swimmer, coach, NBSL representative or designee, or team has repeated offenses, the NBSL officers will be consulted for further actions, to include barring the offender from further participation in the league activities.
