A FOND FAREWELL TO COACH BILL VOIGT



We would like to honor the life and legacy of someone who touched countless lives at the Nadadores, not only as a coach but as a mentor, a guide, and a dear DEAR friend - **Coach Bill Voigt**. He coached at the Nadadores for 19 years, on top of a career that spanned over 50 years. Coach Bill retired in 2017 to pursue teaching at a Buddhist Dharma center in San Francisco. He passed away peacefully on September 20 after a short battle with cancer.

In the water, he was a master of technique, pushing his swimmers to achieve more than they ever thought possible. But more than that, Coach Bill was a living example of resilience, compassion, and mindfulness, deeply rooted in his Buddhist practice, which permeated everything he did, both in and out of the pool.

For Coach Bill, swimming wasn't just a sport—it was a way of life. He taught us, his swimmers and fellow coaches, that each stroke, each breath, and each aspect in the pool held a lesson not just in technique but in life. He showed us how to embrace the journey, to be fully present in every moment, just as he embraced every challenge, with determination and methodical precision. Whether you were a swimmer struggling with self-doubt or a fellow coach seeking advice, Coach Bill always had time for you. His legacy was not in the accolades, but in the hearts and minds of those he inspired to be better athletes or better coaches and, most importantly, better human beings.

Rest in peace, Coach Bill. You will be deeply missed, but your influence will carry on in the life lessons you instilled in all of us!

MAC EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

Nadadores staff have completed training for the management of emergency situations. Our plan covers natural disasters (winds, smoke, earthquakes) man- made disasters (chemical, fire, etc.) and breach of security (intruders, wild animals, hostage situations, etc.) Athlete groups will be trained again in October.



So parents are aware of the protocols: Airhorns and fire alarms will sound at the facility. Athletes will be quickly removed from the facility (different pathways depending on location of entry or emergency type). An emergency text message using TU will be sent to parents. Reunion locations will be either the YMCA parking lot or the Oso Creek Golf Course parking lot. Parents should NOT try to access the MAC parking lot during an emergency. Staff has also been trained in the use of Narcan, which is available in emergency kits in dive, swim, swim school and the MVProShop.

MVND INTRASQUAD MEETS AND NADADORES CUP

The Nadadores Diving program will be adding quarterly intrasquad meets to our competition schedule with the first competition being held October 26 and the second on December 18. We have broken the Elite and Novice programs into four different teams with members from every level being represented on each of the four teams.

The purpose of the intrasquad has two facets. The first is to provide measurable feedback on athlete progress in relation to the program's Key Area's of Focus that we use as the basis for all our learning. The second purpose is to support our team efforts this year with a primary focus on emphasizing a positive environment and bringing the whole of our program together as one team. As the diving program continues to grow, it is important now more than ever to take this step. The intrasquad meets will bring divers together who have never interacted and of varying ages and skill levels. Our athletes will have the opportunity to come together and bond over their love for the sport of diving.

A unique scoring system will be used for these intrasquad meets. There will be 5 judges for the contest who will be judging different elements of the dive. Judge 1 will be looking at the diver's starting position. Judge 2 will be looking at the start of the dive (balance, direction and connection). Judge 3 will be looking at the come out action of the dive. Judge 4 will be looking at the body shape and entry of the dive. Judge 5 will be giving an overall impression. We will be able to provide athletes and families with regular feedback on divers' progress in each one of the directions we perform in a multitude of aspects of the dive. Degree of difficulty of a dive will not be factored into the scores. There will be no places in the intrasquad meet. Divers total scores will be combined with their teammates to determine a ranking of each team to award points towards the overall standings of the Nadador Cup.

The intrasquad meets will be one of the multitude of factors that will contribute to their team's winning of the first annual Nadador Cup. While points will be awarded to the overall standings by the teams rankings in the intrasquad meets, points will also be awarded for athletes' participation in team and community events such as the upcoming Walk Against Drugs on October 19 as well as their team's fundraising efforts during Morning Madness. We want to search for reinforcing aspects of Ubuntu which revolves around the concept of "I am because we all are." While we are part of an individual sport, no one of us can be successful without the support of those around us. Conversely, our efforts for individual success are to support the success of those around us.








SPMS CLUB SWIMMER OF THE MONTH
