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## National Age Group and SCS Records Fall at Winter Juniors

USA Swimming held two Junior National meets in December 2021: East and West. Each of these meets showcases the fastest eighteen and younger athletes in the nation. Sandpipers brought 11 athletes to the Winter Juniors West meet in Austin, Texas.

During this four-day meet, Sandpipers made tidal waves. With the 500 Freestyle on the second day of competition, Bella Sims, Katie Grimes, and Claire Weinstein placed first, second, and third respectively. Them, along with teammate Audrey Yu, also took home gold in the Women's 400 Medley Relay.

The third day of competition was no different. Grimes got gold in the 400 IM, barely missing a national age group record. In the 200 Free, Sims placed first and Weinstein got fourth, clocking in the 3<sup>rd</sup> fastest time ever for a 13–14-year-old swimmer.

On the boys' side of the same night, **Ilya Kharun** shattered the National Age Group record for 15-16 boys in the 100 Butterfly. He swam an incredible race, charging into the wall for a 45.59. The following evening, he followed up this race with a win in the 200 Fly, going a 1:42.39.

After Kharun broke his record, Weinstein destroyed the 13-14 National Age Group record in the 1650 Freestyle. Going a time of 15:52.84, Weinstein beat the previous record by nearly one and a half seconds, taking down Becca Mann's old record of 15:54.46.

At the *Rock the Blocks*—a meet designed for Sandpiper swimmers—athletes competed in three events at our regular pool, Desert Breeze. For the State Championships, athletes traveled to Carson City for a weekend of competitions.

While the formats for these meets were different—State was prelims and finals—the idea behind them is the same. At the Rock the Blocks, Sandpipers learned how to compete at a higher level than they have at practice. These are the same racing skills Sandpipers bring to every competition, especially the State meet. Highlights from the State Meet included the following teammates taking home High Point trophies for finishing first or second in their age group: Allison Dressler, Kennedy Bourke, Alina Johnson, Everett Collins, Carson Phifer, Alex Thornton, Katie Grimes, and Ilya Kharun.

Between the two events, Sandpiper athletes broke team and state records, earned best times, and fought their way to personal victories. To be able to perform at both competitions proves that Sandpipers are bonded with the strongest adhesive: the desire to race.

## SAND BRINGS 24 ATHLETES TO WINTER SECTIONALS

Golden West Swim Club hosted the 2021 CA/NV Winter Sectionals in beautiful Huntington Beach, California. Sandpipers brought 24 athletes to the competition, from both the National Elite and National Prime groups.

In order to compete in Winter Sectionals, athletes must first obtain qualification times. These standards are harder to obtain than State and Junior Olympic times. They require commitment, determination, and effort on a daily basis. All of our athletes exemplified these traits and more. Traditionally, Sectional meets will have between 800 and 1,200 competitors at each site.

Competing against over 30 different teams, SAND dove in ready to race. While their Prelim performances were notable, their results at Finals is where they shined. During the second sessions of each day, Sandpipers demolished best times, placed in the top 8—even the top 3—and performed better than they ever have. When the dust settled, the Sandpipers took home the first-place trophy for Men's, Women's, Combined, both individual high points, and Coach of the Meet! Congratulations to all Sandpipers who competed! Continue to work hard and strive for the value of excellence.

### SANDPIPERS HOST 7TH ANNUAL TYR SUPER FINALS INVITE

December 9<sup>th</sup> through the 12<sup>th</sup>, Sandpipers hosted the annual *TYR Las Vegas Super Finals Invitational!* Like most of the championship level meets, this event had both prelims and finals sessions. However, unlike any other competitions, this format was a little different.

There was still a finals heat—the top 8 swimmers—for each event in each age group. But instead of the last, fastest heat being comprised of fifteen and overs, at this meet, age didn't matter. In each event, the fastest top 8 swimmers regardless of age went head-to-head at the end of the night. With 13 teams traveling from California, Elko, Colorado, Utah, and Las Vegas, the competition was fierce!

The Sandpipers brought over 100 swimmers to St. George, Utah, where the event was hosted. All of them stayed true to their roots, working, racing, and competing to best times, plenty of medals, and a few team records. After a grueling four days of competition, Sandpipers came out second in the overall team rankings.

Shout out to all Sandpiper volunteers, families, and swimmers for making this meet special. We host many meets throughout the year. It is especially difficult to make out-of-town competitions run as smoothly and fluid as this one did. Thank you for all of your hard work!
