Sandpipers Awarded Gold Medal Status

Fourth Straight Honor for Club

The Sandpipers of Nevada has been recognized as a Gold Medal Club for the 4th straight year by USA Swimming's Club Excellence Program. The program identifies clubs that execute strong, well-rounded programs that produce elite 18-and-under athletes. The top 20 clubs earn the Gold level ranking. The Sandpipers finished 5th in the rankings for 2018.

Furthermore, this year, in accordance with USA Swimming's Excellence program recognition, Sandpipers were named to the 2019 Podium Club. This honor is given to teams that have obtained a Gold Medal ranking for four consecutive years. The only two other teams that received this honor in 2019 are Carmel Swim Club (IN) and Nation's Capital Swim Club (PV).

This recognition proves the diligence of every Sandpiper. While obtaining a Gold-medal status is a difficult feat—and an excellent one to highlight—it's tenfold more difficult to be named a Podium Club.

Consistency is key. The Gold Medal rankings are awarded based on a point system. Swimmers first have to qualify for the Gold Medal rank, then based on their performance, they are given a certain amount of points for their individual swims. In 2009, Sandpipers of Nevada had

three swimmers (Cody Miller being one of them) score Gold Medal points for our team. Throughout these 10 years—and because of the extraordinary work-ethic, determination, focus, and grit our team values—we've worked our way up to 13 swimmers scoring points. That's a 430 percent increase!

In addition to earning the title of "Gold Medal Club", gold and silver medal clubs are elgible to apply for a grant through USA Swimming. This grant is then used to continue to better the club through purchases like training equipment or building the Bodyline Gym, to name a couple.

We are proud of what we have accomplished. You should be too! We wouldn't have achieved any of this without you. Thank you for all of your efforts. Let's continue this success and strive to be a Gold Medal Club every year.

Sandpipers Take Silver at Winter Nationals

Four Teammates Punch Ticket to Omaha

Coming off intense Thanksgiving practices with little rest, ten Sandpiper teammates raced into a second-place team finish at USA Swimming's *Winter National Championships*. What makes this feat even more incredible was the second-place combined finish the Sandpipers competed with only 18 and under athletes!

The meet, held in Greensboro, North Carolina saw the Sandpipers collect 5 individual 18-U National Championship titles. Congratulations to **Erica Sullivan** and **Brennan Gravley** for bringing home golds.

Winter Nationals also doubled as the first opportunity for athletes to qualify for the 2020 Olympic Trials. Erica Sullivan, Reese Hazan, Chloe Freeman, and Brennan Gravley were the first Sandpipers to achieve qualifying times, but they won't be the last! 16 more to reach our goal of having 20 Sandpipers in Omaha #20in20. SERVICE HOUR BILLING REMINDER

A Message from the Volunteer Team

With the of the Long Course season on the horizon, here is a reminder of your Service Hour Agreement:

24 service hours are required for the 2018-2019 Team Year

- -12 hours required for the short course season, August-February, unmet hours billed on March 1.
- -12 hours required for the long course season, March-July, unmet hours billed on August 1.
 - **Stroke School groups are exempt from service hours unless competing in a meet**

For Sandpiper hosted meets, if timing positions are not filled online through the meet job sign up, they will be assigned to swimmers entered in the meet. If you cannot complete the job, it is your responsibility to find a replacement or notify the Volunteer Team at sandvolunteerteam@gmail.com. A \$50 no-show fee will apply if the position is not filled, unmet service hours are billed at \$25 per hour.

SAND Well Represented at Pacific Coast All-Star Meet

Southern California Swimming has announced the team selected to compete at the annual *Pacific Coast All-Star Meet*. Congratulations to **Katie Grimes**, **Arabella Sims**, and **Luke Ellis** on your selection to the SCS 2019 Team! Selection is based on an application process that looks at where each swimmer ranks in their respective age group in Southern California across all-events. From there, the Top-8 11-12 and 13-14s that applied are chosen for the team. Only short course yard times competed between September 1 through December 9, 2018, are considered.

This annual age group meet pits Southern Cal's best up and coming athletes against a similar field from the Oregon, Pacific, and Pacific Northwest LSC's. Last year, SoCal ran away with the team title and we are excited for our Teammates to help defend that title! The Sandpipers tied for third most athletes selected for the team this year.

In addition to SAND sending three athletes, **Coach Jake Des Roches** has been asked to be the Lead Coach for the 11-12 Boys. Congrats Coach Jake on your appointment! The SAND crew will be heading down to Commerce, California for the two-day meet held January 5-6th.
