## TNAQ ATHLETE CODE OF CONDUCT

TNAQ's Code of Conduct ensures every member of Tennessee Aquatics represents the team and themselves in a positive manner. The following Code is in effect throughout the year.

- 1. TNAQ team members shall exhibit good sportsmanship at all times. TNAQ team members win gracefully, lose graciously, and congratulate their opponents in either case.
- 2. TNAQ athletes shall be respectful of their peers, coaches, officials, parents, and facilities at all times.
- 3. TNAQ team members shall not illegally consume or purchase: alcohol; tobacco, whether for smoking, chewing, or vaping; or use any illegal drug or USOC banned substance of any kind. In addition, any team member found or suspected to be in the **presence of others** (regardless of team affiliation) participating in any of the above illegal activities will be subject to the same punishments, including the potential loss of the privilege of being a member of TNAQ.
- 4. The use of audio or visual recording, including a cell phone camera, is not allowed in changing areas, restrooms or locker rooms at any time.
- Cell phone use at TNAQ activities (including during practices and throughout meets) should be limited to emergency communications or for otherwise important and necessary purposes only.
- Athletes are expected to make responsible use of social media and at all times conduct themselves in a manner consistent with being a good teammate and representatives of TNAQ.

TNAQ's disciplinary procedures will apply to any team member violating the Athlete Code of Conduct.

## **Potential Disciplinary Actions**

Failure to abide by the TNAQ Athlete Code of Conduct may result in any or all of the following:

- a. Athlete may have the behavior addressed by the Coaches.
- b. Athlete may be asked to sit out of practice for a limited period of time.
- c. Athlete may be scratched from competitions or not be allowed to participate in team activities.
- d. Athlete may be asked to leave practice.
- e. Athlete may be suspended from all team activities, including practice, for a period of time (definite or indefinite).
- f. In severe circumstances,
  - a. Athlete may be dismissed from the team; and/or
  - b. Reported to USA Diving, the USOPC Center for SafeSport, or law enforcement.

It is anticipated and intended that all involved will have a positive experience. For the safety of our members, rule violations will be dealt with in a direct manner. The very best is expected from all Tennessee Aquatics members.
