

DART Code of Conduct

The purpose of this code is to promote a safe, positive, and productive team environment. All team members including swimmers, coaching staff, and parents are required to adhere to this code during team sponsored events including, but not limited to practice, swim meets, travel meets or other team gatherings.

Swimmer Code of Conduct

- 1. Team members are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship at all times. They shall show courtesy and respect toward coaches, officials, administrators, teammates, fellow competitors and the public.
- 2. DART swimming takes pride in providing a positive team environment. Swimmers are expected to represent our team in a positive manner in and out of the pool.
- 3. Swimmers are expected to follow the directions of any member of the coaching staff, respect any instructions by officials and any person who is a chaperone.
- 5. DART and USA Swimming prohibit bullying. Bullying is the use of aggression, whether intentional or not, which hurts another person. Swimmers are expected to respect one another.
- 6. Swimmers are to refrain from inappropriate physical contact at practices, events and meets.
- 7. Questions or concerns regarding decisions made by meet officials are directed to a coach.
- 8. USA Swimming prohibits deck changing. Athletes must use available changing facilities.
- 9. Swimmers are expected to use appropriate language. Use of profane or abusive language or obscene gestures will not be tolerated.
- 10. Swimmers are expected to follow all travel policies for team trips and travel meets.
- 11. Swimmers are expected to follow all of the rules and regulations outlined in our Safe Sport and MAAPP policies.

DART Swimming is a family-friendly team. Your experience in our program as well as the development your athlete dependant on a positive partnership between the parents, coaches and athletes.

Discipline

Violation of any of these rules will result in disciplinary action as determined by the coaches and/or Board of Directors.

Penalties include, but are not limited to the following:

A verbal warning. A coach will contact the parent. Suspension from practice for a period of one week. (There will be NO prorated fee for monthly dues.)

A written warning from the Head Coach or the Board of Directors.

Suspension from the team or travel meet or event.

Expulsion from the team.
