Teams submitting a bid to host a SNS Championship Meet will be required to follow the guidelines in the SNS Policies & Procedures Manual

- 1. Teams must demonstrate that they have enough volunteers to host a large, championship caliber meet.
- 2. The choice of vendors must comply with LSC contracts.
- 3. Meets will be held in a 4-day format for SWAGR & the Bill Rose Classic (Thursday-Sunday) and a 3-day format (Friday-Sunday) for the SNS Senior Short Course Championships & the SNS 14 & Under Short Course Championships.
- 4. Meet Announcements must be available at least 8 weeks prior to the start of the meet.
- 5. SWIMS/Swim Connection time verification will be used to verify entry times. Only times in this database will count for qualifying times.
- 6. The host team shall provide evaluation forms to coaches, parents and swimmers throughout the meet. (The Sierra Nevada Scheduling Committee will evaluate these forms after the meet).
- 7. Results shall be posted in a timely manner:
  - 1. Complete preliminary results must be posted no later than 30 minutes after the completion of each preliminaries session.
  - 2. Finals results must be posted before the start of the next day's preliminaries session.
- 8. Team scores and high point scores shall be announced at least once per session.
- 9. Results shall be sent by e-mail to teams either Sunday night or Monday morning after the meet.
- 10. The host team must send complete results to Swim Connection by Monday following the meet (using SDIF format).
- 11. Teams should prepare a written plan for the meet outlining the following:
  - 1. Parking
  - 2. How local media will be utilized.
  - 3. Finals program (music, parading of swimmers, etc.)
  - 4. Organization of volunteers
- 12. Hospitality should be sufficient and appropriate for A Trials and Finals meet.
  - 1. Snacks throughout the day
  - 2. Drinks throughout the day
  - 3. Lunch provided.
  - 4. Dinner provided.
- 13. It is preferred, but not required, that the facility hosting this meet have at least 3 short course or 2 long course warm-up and warm-down lanes available while the meet is in session.
- 14. The host team should engage an educated and enthusiastic announcer to provide commentary for finals sessions.
