Meet Type:	Timed Finals

USA Swimming	At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a
Rules	USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.
	 Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge.
	 When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.
	 The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
	 Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. Deck changing is prohibited. Per USA Swimming Code of Conduct 304.3.7, persons violating this provision are subject to ejection from the facility.
	 Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.



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Safe Sport 360

The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) prohibits Applicable Adults (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. Applicable Adults are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet.

- All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject
 to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that
 they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the
 conduct of this competition.
- Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member's
 responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including
 physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must
 occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible
 information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. A report to the U.S.
 Center for SafeSport may be made via telephone at 720-531-0340 or online at
 www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern. Various state laws may also require reporting to
 law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency.
- All athletes aged 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. Any athlete who turns 18 on or after the first day of the start of competition, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after the first day of competition, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay.
- All participants and competitors shall follow the US Center for SafeSport rules for bullying found on USA Swimming and Kentucky Swimming sites. A violation will be grounds for removal of member from the facility.

Regulations/Waivers

Waiver/Release

- By entering this meet, you are granting permission for the names of any or all your team's swimmers to be published in the form of Psych Sheets, Meet Results, or any other documents associated with the running of this meet.
- All participants agree to be filmed and photographed by the host club approved photographer(s) and videographers and to allow the right to use names and pictures before, during, or after the meet such as in public psych sheets, heat sheets, and results or featured on the host club website or social media or in public broadcast of the event via television or webcast. Parents and guardians of minor swimmers who do not wish their swimmers to participate in interviews or have individual pictures featured on any media should inform their team's head coach and the Meet Director prior to the meet.

Meet Entry & Operation Guidelines

Eligibility:

- All contestants must be currently registered USA Swimming members. Registrations will not be accepted at the meet.
- All adult athletes must hold current Athlete Protection Training certification.
- Age on the first day of the meet will determine age for the entire meet.

Entry Limits	 Swimmers may swim a maximum of 5 individual events per day. Swimmers may swim in a maximum of 1 relay event per day. Entries will be taken on a 1st Come, 1st Served basis and will close at a max of 250 swimmers per session. 						
Entry Fees	\$6 per individual event. \$8 per relay event. \$2.50 KY LSC surcharge per swimmer. \$15 Facility Fee per swimmer						
Late Entries	 Swimmers not previously entered in the meet must provide proof of current USA Swimming registration. All Deck Entries are at the discretion of the Meet Director and will be accepted only if the deck entries can be accomplished without the addition of extra heats. All deck entered swimmers will be placed in the first heat. Fees are \$12.00 per individual event and \$16.00 relays due when turning in deck entries

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	 Checks should be made payable to: Owensboro Marlins. The Meet Director reserves the right to limit entries, if necessary, to manage the timeline and number of competitors at each session. Handwritten, telephoned, or faxed entries will not be accepted with the exception of the report sheet provided for utilization when entering swimmers with a disability. If the USA Swimming ID for any swimmer is omitted, that swimmer's entries will not be accepted.
Warm-up and Safety Guidelines	 A complete schedule of warm-up procedures to include lane assignments and times, which must be adhered to by all participants will be distributed in advance of the meet. Warm-ups will be monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees). Except during supervised racing starts, swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner from the start end of the pool. No spectators allowed on deck.
Competition Guidelines	All USA Swimming Registered Officials and Coaches are required to display USA Swimming Credentials (USA Swimming Membership Card) while on deck. All coaches need to check in with the Meet Director to get credentials to be on deck.
Awards	 Ribbons will be given out to places 1 thru 8 for individual events for 12 and under swimmers only (13 and over events will not receive ribbons even if 12 and under swimmers compete). High point individual medals will be given to the top swimmer in each age group and gender. Eight & Under events will be scored as 6 & Under and 7-8. Ten & Under events will be scored as 6 & under, 7-8, 9-10. Eleven & Over events will be scored as 11-12, 13-14 and 15 & Over. Thirteen & Over events will be scored 13-14 and 15 & Over. Only events designated for a particular age group will be scored for that age group for purposes of high point awards. Every attempt will be made to have ribbons and awards ready at the end of the meet, but they may be mailed later.
Admission/ Heat Sheets	\$5.00 admission per day (children 12 and under free) \$5.00 Heat Sheet for Meet Food concessions will be available
Timers/Counters	Clubs may be required to provide timers based upon their number of entries. Swimmers have to provide their own counters and timers for the 500 freestyle and 1650 freestyle.
Hospitality	Will be available to all coaches and officials.
