Meet Type	There are no time standards for this meet. This is a timed-finals competition with 8-under, 9-10, 11-12, 12 & Under age groups. Age on December 14, 2025 determines age-group for the meet. USA swimming rules apply. FINA starting procedures, approved by USA Swimming, uses a series of whistles followed by a one whistle announcement for the swimmers. The No Recall Start Rule will also be enforced during this meet. Fly-over starts will be used at the discretion of the Meet Referee.

USA Swimming Rules	• At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.
	 Coaches must be current coach members of USA Swimming in Good Standing and must present credentials upon request.
	 Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge.
	• When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.
	• The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
	• Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups.
	 Deck changing is prohibited. Per USA Swimming Code of Conduct 304.3.7, persons violating this provision are subject to ejection from the facility.
	Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach)

Safe Sport 360	 The USA Swimming Safe Sport program is USA Swimming's comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.
	 The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) prohibits Applicable Adults (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. 	 Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member's responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. 	 All athletes aged 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. Any athlete who turns 18 on or after the first day of the start of competition, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after the first day of competition, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay. All participants and competitors shall follow the US Center for SafeSport rules for bullying found on USA Swimming and Kentucky Swimming sites. 	not be allowed. Flash photography is prohibited during the start of the heats.
	5. GLASS CONTAINERS ARE BANNED FROM THE COMPLEX; NO FOOD IS ALLOWED ON DECK.
	6. Any act of vandalism against Transylvania University will require immediate attention by the Meet
	Director. The University Police Department will be called and a report filed. Culprits could be
	expelled from one or more sessions, as determined by the meet director, team coach, and KYLSC.

Guidelines	 Coaches should be prepared to share lane space with other teams. Assignments will be determined once the meet is closed and entries are received and conveyed to coaches prior to December 11, 2025. There is a 250-swimmer limit. Warm-ups will be monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees). Except during supervised racing starts, swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner from the start end of the pool. No spectators allowed on deck.

- Wall lane placement
- Personal Assistant for mobility or communications
- Examples of Modifications per Art. 105 in accordance with 105.1.2.
- Sitting position on block 105.5.1.E(1).
- Starter's arm signals 105.3.1
- Personal Assistant for mobility, tapper (B/VI) or communication, etc. 105.1.3.C and elsewhere.
- Legs due to immobility are unable to perform Breaststroke Kick 105.5.2.
