Approval of January 26, 2020 Board Meeting Minutes: Ruth Ann Bode moved/Terri Tonges seconded/minutes approved as read.

Approval of March 11, 2020 Board Meeting Minutes: Ruth Ann Bode moved/Chip Augustus seconded/minutes approved as read.

Approval of March 12, 2020 Board Meeting Minutes: Brian Johnson moved/Ruth Ann Bode seconded/minutes approved as read.

Financial Report: Bobby Livesay, Finance Chair, submitted a Profit and Loss Report using actual income and expense through April 6, adjusted income and expenses through August 31 and a prediction of approximately \$10,000 income – see below. There is \$85,000-\$90,000 in reserve. Bobby is concerned more for the 2020-2021 registration period and how COVID-19 will affect future membership. The LSC can last a year without income. He recommends that before the next budget year, prioritization of programming support be investigated and decide if anything can be omitted.

Amy Albiero, General Chair: She is watching closely USA Swimming and state updates. USA Swimming should make decisions on sanctioning within the next week or two.

Bucky Stoess moved/Ruth Ann Bode seconded/Discussion: Terri Tonges mentioned that she thought KYA was not able to host for 2021 and that she would not be in favor of the extension if the club holding the bid was unable or did not want to

host the 2021 short course championship. Amy replied by saying that if awarded, the club would have the opportunity to refuse the offer.

Motion approved to extend host club's contract for the short course championship meets for one more year through 2021. Ruth Ann moved/Becky Gilpatrick seconded to extend host club's contract for the long course championship meets for one more year through 2021 if the 2020 long course championship series is canceled. Bucky Stoess moved to table the motion/Ruth Ann Bode withdrew the motion.

Bucky asked if USA Swimming had mentioned reducing membership fees. Amy indicated that it was being discussed.

2020 Age Group Zones was discussed, and the consensus was that it would not be logical sending a team if they had not had ample time to train.

Amy would like to have a meeting every two weeks.
