USA Swimming Rules	At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.					
Naies	 Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. 					
	• The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.					
	 Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. 					
	 Deck changing is prohibited. Per USA Swimming Code of Conduct 304.3.7, persons violating this provision are subject to ejection from the facility. 					



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Regulations/Waiver	's
	Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.
	Flash photography is not permitted at the start of any race.
	All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition.
Safe Sport 360	 The USA Swimming Safe Sport program is USA Swimming's comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.
	The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) prohibits Applicable Adults (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. Any athlete who turns 18 on or after the first day of the start of competition, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after the first day of competition, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay. All participants and competitors shall follow the US Center for SafeSport rules for bullying found on USA Swimming and Kentucky Swimming sites. A violation will be grounds for removal of member from

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Entry Procedures	Entries: Entries must be submitted electronically, using the Hy-Tek Meet Manager or Team Manager Software. Entries may be e-mailed to: coachpatsyomm@gmail.com Team entries must be received by Sunday, February 23, 2024 Swimmers may enter up to 5 events per day. Swimmers not previously entered in the meet must provide proof of current USA Swimming registration. All Deck Entries are at the discretion of the Meet Director and will be accepted only if the deck entries can be accomplished without the addition of extra heats. All deck entered swimmers will be placed in the slow heat if empty lanes exist. Any request for a time trial will be considered at the meet. Time trials will occur at the end of the session at the discretion of the Meet Referee. Handwritten, telephoned, or faxed entries will not be accepted with the exception of the report sheet provided for utilization when entering swimmers with a disability. If the USA Swimming ID for any swimmer is omitted, that swimmer's entries will not be accepted.
Warm-up and Safety Guidelines	 A complete schedule of warm-up procedures to include lane assignments and times, which must be adhered to by all participants will be distributed in advance of the meet. Warm-ups will be monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees). Except during supervised racing starts, swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner from the start end of the pool. No spectators allowed on deck.
Competition Guidelines	All USA Swimming Registered Officials and Coaches are required to display USA Swimming Credentials (USA Swimming Membership Card) while on deck. All coaches need to check in with the Meet Director to get credentials to be on deck.

Examples of Meet Accommodations and Modifications in accordance with Article 105

- Towel on block to start.

- Assistance at the block before and/or during the start

- Takes longer to get to the block or exit pool.

- Preferred lane placement and/or exit to ladder
- Sitting or alternative position on block (105.5.1.E(1)) Starter's arm signals (105.3.1)
- Personal Assistant for mobility, tapper (B/VI) or communication
- Legs due to immobility are unable to perform Breaststroke Kick
- Any modification of a technical rule allowing parallel performance for a swimmer with a disability
