Introduction of Zone Officers

Agenda distributed and approved

Dave Smith, Non-Coach Zone Director

Herb Schwab, Secretary/Treasurer

Herb reported that the Southern Zone account balance is \$17,636.90, which includes the earmarked funds for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion of \$5,204.57. The Financial Report is on the Southern Zone website and is attached.

Trish Martin/Traci Johnson, Officials Chair

Trish's report on the activities of the Zone Officials is on the Southern Zone website and is attached. Trish recognized and thanked the Meet

Referees of the Spring Sectional Meets. There were no Summer Sectionals nor Zone Championship Meets this year.

Annie Norris, Senior Athlete Representative

Annie's report on the activities of the Athletes Representatives is on the Southern Zone website and is attached.

The Athletes conducted weekly video meetings this year, along with a virtual workshop and other engagement-type events. The Athletes focused on getting the athletes organized and involved, using the video meetings and social media. The virtual workshop videos are available on the Zone website.

Ryan Gibbons, Junior Athlete Representative

Ryan reported on the upcoming Athlete Representatives elections, which will be held tomorrow. The Athletes spent this past year getting organized as a committee and will focus on goals to serve the athletes, General Chairs, and LSCs for this upcoming year. The Athletes will also focus on DE&I efforts for this coming year. The athletes will work on an Athlete Workshop for 2021, which may be held virtually again.

USA Swimming Leadership Presentations

Bob Vincent, Mike Unger, and Joel Shinofield addressed the Zone Delegates.

Mike updated the Delegates about the Virtual Convention for this year. At this time, there are over 800 delegates registered. Mike discussed the Convention topics, the Agenda, and the House of Delegates meetings. Everything is posted on the USA Swimming website, along with all of the Committee Meeting Notices.

Mike also updated the Delegates with information about Olympic Trials in Omaha in 2021. There are backup plans, in case of issues with the Omaha venue. The dates are one week earlier than were scheduled for 2020, but the TV coverage should include more hours. Currently, the Trials Cuts are the same, but those cuts will be re-evaluated later this year.

Bob updated the Delegates about meet sanctioning issues. Hopefully, the LSCs will have the full authority to sanction meets in the near future.

Joel updated the Delegates about the weekly, and subsequently monthly, LSC meetings that have been held. The Board will be reviewing the plans for the fall national meets. Winter Juniors will probably be organized in a de-centralized fashion where each LSC can host their own competition to avoid large gatherings and long travel. Each LSC will have the flexibility to host the meet as best fits their needs. The US Open will probably be held at several locations, probably 6-10 locations, to conform to the smaller gathering restrictions.

Dave reported on the Zone Officials that have been included on the FINA list. Congratulations to Jason Johnson as a FINA Starter and Trish Martin as a FINA Referee.

Jim discussed some upcoming rules proposals that will modify the Sectional Meet requirements and the sizes of the Sectional Meets. These requirements have been added to the working copy of the Zone Policies and Procedures.

There is a proposed rule that would eliminate the Zone Bylaws and require the Zones to have a Policies and Procedures Manual. Dave and Jim are in the process of merging our current Bylaws and Policies and Procedures into one document. If this rule change passes, Dave and Jim will send out the proposed changes to the Delegates for their input and the Zone will vote on the changes at a later meeting.

Dave proposed changing the Open Water Chair position to an elected, voting position in the Zone. This change will be voted on during the September 27th meeting.

Dave announced that Rayleen Soderstrom has been re-appointed as the SZ Disability Coordinator.

Don Henshaw continues to do a great job as the SZ Webmaster.

Zone Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Camps will now be conducted by USA Swimming. The information for these camps has been distributed to the LSCs and more information may be obtained from Ruth Ann Bode or MJ Truex.

Annie Norris has been instrumental in conducting weekly ZOOM Meetings with the LSC Athlete Representatives. She and Ryan Gibbons have been instrumental in conducting a very successful SZ Athlete Workshop. She is now working as the AEC Programming and Events Chair, but will still be available as a valuable mentor to our SZ Athletes.

Elections for the SZ Senior and Junior Athlete Representatives will be conducted tomorrow and they will be introduced to the Delegates at our meeting on September 27th.

Herb asked all of the Sections to email their dates and locations for the 2021 Sectional Meets to him by the September 27th meeting.

Dave reminded the Delegates that the next meeting of the Southern Zone will be held on Sunday, September 27, at 7 pm Eastern Time, when we will vote on the sites of the Zone Championships and the change in the Open Water Chair position. The LSCs have the opportunity to use the next two weeks to discuss their voting

Southern Zone Athlete Workshop 2020 Report

On July 11, 2020, the Southern Zone Athlete Representatives hosted the first-ever Southern Zone Athlete Workshop, intended to develop professional and personal skills across our LSC Athlete Representatives. The event, occurring from 2-7:30PM ET, occurred entirely via Zoom (including the use of Breakout Rooms), and made use of software such as Mural and Google Forms to enhance the athletes' experience.

Planning & Development

Planning and execution of the Workshop was primarily the task of the Workshop Task Force, consisting of Annie Norris (Zone Sr. Rep), Ryan Gibbons (Zone Jr. Rep), Ellery Parish (Senior Mentor), Matthew Rigsbee (Media & Engagement), Annika Reuhlicke (Administrative Consultant), and Lauren Hurt (LSC Rep Consultant). After over two years of ideation, tangible planning for the Workshop started in April of 2020, and an estimated 250-300+ total man-hours of work by athlete volunteers ultimately resulted in such a successful turnout.

Non-athlete support was given by Dave Smith (SZ Non-Coach Director), Jim Kelly (SZ Coach Director), Herb Schwab (SZ Secretary/Treasurer), Kathleen Klein Prindle (USA-S Board Member), and Kenneth Chung (USA-S Board Member), both before and during the Workshop.

Content & Curriculum

The Workshop was designed to be complementary to existing athlete leadership curricula, focusing instead on tangible skills specific to the role of an Athlete Representative and the athletes' future professional careers. Athletes were encouraged to enter the Workshop with workable ideas for projects, legislation, or events relevant to their LSC, with the intent that the Workshop would provide them with skills and guidance necessary to grow, develop, and execute upon this idea.

In the weeks leading up to the Workshop, each individual LSC athlete cohort met briefly with a member of the Workshop Task Force in "Pre-Workshop Sessions". These sessions had two main intents: identifying and brainstorming possible ideas (as previously mentioned) to be a focus throughout the event, and gauging for our development-specific sessions at what level an LSC would receive the most benefit from (see "Track Programming" below).

Introduction: 2:00-3:15PM ET:

Our introduction focused on three main segments: initial steps and icebreakers, strength-specific development, and LSC-specific culture building.

We began with personal introductions and a brief icebreaker, explaining the day's sessions and events before asking attendees to share and explain an item of personal significance. We then progressed into strength-specific development, focused on identifying attendee's specific personal talents and abilities to best contribute to any group. In the weeks leading up to the Workshop, attendees were asked to create a Good & Co. profile, a software that asks personality and productivity questions before providing analytical information about team compatibility and personal capabilities. Athletes were then sorted by common traits (without being told what the trait was), discussed amongst themselves in breakout rooms with a Workshop leader to figure out what their common trait was, and were then asked to evaluate the benefits and weaknesses of this trait. Athletes were encouraged to consider how they could use such traits in their work within USA Swimming and all aspects of their lives. You can find their workspace for this discussion here:

The Introduction then concluded with an LSC-specific section, wherein attendees were sorted into breakout rooms by LSC and were assigned a Workshop leader to discuss with. They then discussed, evaluating their individual strengths, weaknesses, and traits, what the most successful working paths forward might be, and how their LSC work could be aligned most productively with their individual characters. Professional Communications: 3:25-4:05PM ET:

This session focused on professional communication, with an emphasis on adjusting these skills as necessary for the virtual world (an increasingly common feature of these athletes' work). The content emphasized the continued need to evaluate tone, audience, and purpose when communication in any situation, and on adjusting these factors as needed to create effective communication paths. Specific emphasis was placed on how these factors can be translated to electronic communication and messages (texts & emails) and real-time communication (Zoom and in-person meetings). Real-life and engaging examples were used as much as possible; communication is generally taught in-person to Athlete Reps and we had to compensate for that loss of efficacy.

The session concluded with a hands-on activity; athletes were grouped into specific breakout rooms with a non-athlete leader and were sent based on their group an email from a specific individual about a similar situation, before being asked to respond accordingly. In our situation, we discussed a negative facility change just weeks before a championship meet, and sent emails in a variety of tones and backgrounds to challenge our attendees to create the most effective specific response. They were then provided with constructive feedback on their response.

<u>Track Programming: 4:30-5:30PM ET:</u>

Based on their Pre-Workshop Sessions, athletes were separated into two tracks: Track 1 for LSC cohorts with less experience or LSC development, and Track 2 for LSC cohorts with a more developed and extensive history of athlete representation. Track 1 focused primarily on building foundational skills for project development and execution, and Track 2 focused more on the fine-tuning and advanced portions of legislation and events.

<u>Track 1:</u> Athlete Representatives were guided through the foundations of project development, including the ideation and execution processes. Athletes serving on the Rules and Regulations Committee spoke about the basics of legislation and affiliated projects, and the AEC Programming & Events Chair spoke similarly about the process of creating and hosting an event-based project. Athletes were then broken out into breakout rooms, and encouraged to discuss with Workshop leaders their progress and future steps. To see the athletes' workspace, use this link:

<u>Track 2</u>: Athlete Representatives were given more advanced information regarding legislation and event development, also from the Rules & Regulations Committee Athletes and from the AEC Programming & Events Chair. The Track 2 session consisted of a substantial amount of work time, wherein LSC Reps were given breakout rooms to discuss their progress and could communicate with Workshop leaders as they pleased. This session was primarily focused on building more complex existing ideas into highly-functional final products. To see the athletes' workspace, use this link:

LSC Non-Athlete Leadership Discussion: 4:45-5:30PM ET:

All LSC General Chairs were invited and encouraged to attend this section of the workshop, and were also encouraged to invite other LSC non-athlete leaders as beneficial. Van Donkersgoed (WI) and Joe Gazzarato (MI) were guest speakers for this session as Athlete Reps who then went on to become LSC General Chairs. They spoke on their experiences in both roles and about the support and relationships which they have built with their LSC Athlete Representatives, before answering questions (along with Workshop leaders) from the LSC leaders about further including and supporthis their LSC Athlete Representatives.

LSC Breakout Rooms: 5:30-6:00PM ET:

Athletes and non-athletes were brought together and separated into LSC-specific breakout rooms to discuss what each had learned in their respective workshops. Discussions were encouraged to be driven around the Athletes' projects and ideas, and specifically how the non-athletes could provide feedback and assistance as they worked forward towards executing

and implementing them. Workshop leaders floated between breakout rooms, and any breakout room could request assistance/discussion with a Workshop leader at any time.

Speaker Panel: 6:15-7:15PM ET:

Through connections offered by a couple of non-athlete and athlete leaders, our speaker panel ultimately consisted of Missy & Hayes Johnson and Katie Hoff, who spoke to the theme of "maximizing potential". The panel focused greatly on leadership skills and transitioning swimming experiences to professional and personal pursuits, with each speaker discussing their experiences therein. The speakers then engaged in a Q&A with our attendees, discussing a wide range of topics and ideas. Nonathletes were also invited to attend this panel.

Conclusion: 7:15-7:30PM ET:

In our brief conclusion, athletes were asked to reflect on their experiences throughout the Workshop, and consider what their next steps would be in alignment with the skills they gained. We closed with a reminder of the importance of community and camaraderie, encouraging our Athlete Reps to support each other in all of their pursuits and to value above all else the friendships and relationships they develop throughout their work within the sport.

Feedback

Feedback from our attendees was overwhelmingly positive. Every single athlete submitting the anonymous end-of-Workshop feedback form indicated that they were engaged throughout the entire event and learned something new and important. Athletes rated their overall experience as being, on average, 4.88 on a scale of 1 to 5, with not a single attendee rating it lower than "4". Each individual session received similarly positive feedback, with not a single attendee rating any session as being less than a "3" on scales of 1 to 5 for engagement and overall quality.

Some constructive feedback focused primarily on the timing of the Workshop, with many attendees suggesting that the given breaks be longer. Athletes generally felt that the introduction and the speaker section were the most engaging sessions, while the speaker section and the track programming were the most informative/helpful.

Summary & Future Opportunities

The Workshop was, as a whole, successful beyond our highest expectations - athletes maintained impressive levels of engagement, all discussion was high-quality, and each and every session seemed to be received as being quite helpful and enriching. As this was our first time ever running this event - and the first time any Zone has run any sort of similar workshop - we were expecting far more troubles, "dead space", and difficulty than we ever experienced during our July 11 event. While only time will tell if our attendees are able to utilize their gained

skills and experiences to instill tangible benefits in their work towards their LSCs, we feel confident that they will have the opportunity and ability to do so.

Looking towards the future, we find that we are nearing a point wherein we are maximizing our ability given our current circumstances. While a virtual workshop did allow us to run the event with a shorter planning time, and ultimately allowed us to hold this event in the COVID world, the restrictions of this means of operations became quite clear. The overall efficacy of any of our curriculum was decreased by our inability to meet and work in-person, our ability to discuss communications was specifically limited by our inability to interact with in-person communications, and primarily, because we cannot ask for our athletes to sit on an over-extensive Zoom call, the workable time with which we had to go through content was much more compressed. While we can change and shift some content, and make some adjustments to time allotments, we have created a Workshop with substantial potential dependent on the opportunities it is given: we likely cannot grow it much more in a virtual setting.

As such, our next steps are going to primarily include identifying ways in which this can ultimately become an in-person event. Seeking funding specifically through the Zone budget would be ideal; however, we as a Zone Board have decided not to propose an increase at the 2020 Zone Meeting due to the ongoing financial situations many of our LSCs find themselves in. We are considering possibly identifying other opportunities for funding and growth, and while we have some creative solutions, we are going to be mostly dependent on the ability of groups other than the Southern Zone to provide funding if an in-person event is to occur in 2021 (because of the hold on a Southern Zone budget increase, we will not have adequate funding to host an event before 2022).

We believe strongly, especially after seeing the incredible success and efficacy of this pilot event, that these workshops and their curriculum may be a key way in which we can further benefit our athlete governance leaders and, accordingly, our sport as a whole. We are committed to finding ways in which this event can be grown and developed to enhance the opportunities our athletes are given to make change within their LSCs and USA Swimming, and look forward to the hopefully successful and growing future of the Southern Zone Athlete Workshop within the greater context of USA Swimming's operations.

USA Swimming Southern Zone Championship 2022

Dear Selection Committee,

The Greater Morgantown area is extremely interested in hosting USA Swimming's 2022 Southern Zone Championship. We feel that our destination is well suited to meet your event needs of transportation, hotels, and amenities located in "Almost Heaven" West Virginia.

Morgantown is located in North Central West Virginia and strategically located at the intersection of Interstate 79 and 68. Although we may be at the northern most edge of your Southern Zone territory, we are serviced by three airports and within an easy day's drive of almost 20% of the United State's population. Pittsburgh International Airport is 80 miles north of Morgantown. It is serviced by 14 airlines and has a \$1.1 billion renovation planned to be completed by 2023. North Central West Virginia Airport is 30 miles south of Morgantown and is serviced by United Airlines and Allegiant Airlines. The third airport servicing Morgantown is the Morgantown Municipal Airport which is serviced by Southern Airways who flies multiple flights daily to Pittsburgh International Airport and Baltimore/ Washington International Airport. Transportation to and from the airports servicing the Greater Morgantown area is available as needed.

Numerous lodging options are also available. Many of the major hotel chains are in our marketplace and have a wide range of options from full-service Marriott, multiple midrange Marriott, Hilton, and Choice International properties, to economy brands. The vibrant local economy frequently attracts new properties to add to Morgantown's more than 30 lodging properties that provide more than 2,500 room nights daily. Lodging options are located throughout the Morgantown area, providing various venues from downtown properties close to WVU's Main Campus to properties located at our multiple shopping developments as well as interstate properties. We also have multiple restaurants and retail establishments such as Dick's Sporting Goods, Sam's Club, Walmart, and Target in very close proximity to our athletic facilities. This nucleus of retail and hospitality options makes our location very favorable for the tournaments and large-scale events.

Being the home of the West Virginia University Mountaineers, creates a robust sports environment. Mountaineer Country has multiple organizations that work collaboratively to advance more than \$61M of sports development projects since 2015. The two major projects were the Monongalia County Ballpark, and the Aquatic Center and Track and Field Complex at



Mylan Park. Organizations involved in bringing these projects to completion included, but are not limited to, the City of Morgantown, the Monongalia County Commission, the City of Westover, the Town of Granville, Star City, West Virginia University, West Virginia University Hospitals, The Partnership of Greater Morgantown (Chamber, Economic Development Authority, and an urban development organization), local private foundations, Visit Mountaineer Country Convention and Visitors Bureau, the West Virginia Department of Commerce, the West Virginia Governor's Office, and numerous local businesses. The Monongalia County Ballpark involved Tax Increment Financing and opened in 2015. The Aquatic Center and Track and Field Complex at Mylan Park, involved extensive collaborative public and private financing and opened in 2019.

The most recent facilities developed were the Monongalia County Ball Park, home of the West Virginia Blackbears, and the Aquatic Center and Track and Field Complex at Mylan Park. These cutting-edge facilities were designed, developed, and financed by extensive cooperative efforts of local community partners, private, and public resources. Mylan Park also has additional facilities that are a prime destination for competitive sports. These include baseball, softball, soccer, multipurpose fields, cross country track, a miracle field, and more than one indoor facility. All of the facilities and activities are part of the reason that Morgantown has been recognized as the one of the "30 Best Small Sports Cities" in the U.S. according to Wallet Hub.

Another area of interest to you may be our healthcare facilities and programs. Healthcare is one of the larger segments of our local economy. West Virginia University Medical School, WVU Medicine's J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital, and Mon Health Systems all reside locally and provide cutting edge care throughout the region. Ruby Memorial Hospital is the level 1 trauma center in North Central West Virginia. In addition, sports medicine has been integrated throughout the community for decades and continues to advance through their community outreach programs. You will find that our healthcare network would be a great partner in providing any care that might be needed during your 2022 Southern Zone Championship.

Amenities of our "Almost Heaven" home are numerous. It is no wonder that West Virginia has been referred to as the Grand Canyon of the East Coast. 2019-2020 Report

Southern Zone Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Coordinator

This year saw the implementation of new governance structures within USAS and the LSCs represented. By the beginning of 2020, all of the Southern Zone LSCs reported updating their governance structures and several made changes to how they positioned Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) within that structure. For several LSCs, DEI became a member of the Board of Directors (BOD) for the LSC – congratulations to Florida Gold for making the DEI a voting position. South Carolina is submitting legislation in their October HOD to have DEI become a voting member! Goal: increase that to over half of SZ LSCs.

Many LSCs are actively engaging their athletes in DEI. Kentucky had its first ever athlete leadership workshop (KYLEADS) in December. Athletes from across the state gathered to discuss DEI, Personal Leadership, and to form a working athlete committee for the LSC. Florida swimming has athlete reps for each of its six areas. South Carolina Swimming has an active athlete DEI committee that's meeting monthly. The LSC is also hoping to have a combined senior, age group, and open water DEI virtual camp September 18-20. Goal: have more than half of LSCs form an athlete DEI committee or have an athlete representative on the LSC DEI committee.

Communication is key, especially in the strange times that 2020 became in March with Covid shutdowns. Both Florida and South Carolina report making/updating DEI tabs on their LSC websites. Florida is developing a plan for DEI information placement in heat sheets. Most of the LSCs utilize virtual meetings to stay updated (Zoom, Facebook live, etc). I continue to share to our Southern Zone DEI Facebook page information regarding issues related to DEI. Goal: have a virtual Zoom/Facebook live meeting for the LSC DEI chairs quarterly.

Camp update for 2021: No information at this time from USAS on Zone DEI Select Camp (if they will be held/where/when to be held).

The National DEI Committee is actively formatting a virtual meeting program for the 2020 USAS Annual meeting. As the SZ DEI Coordinator, I am involved in that planning but nothing is defined at this time.

2020 Disability Report

Southern Zone

The responsibilities of the disability coordinator include disseminating information related to swimmers with a disability to all LSCs. Since this position had been unfilled for an indeterminate length of time, the first task was to create a contact list to determine who should be the point of contact for this information. All 15 LSCs were contacted. 9 have a designated disability chair, 1 is in the process of replacing the chair, 4 do not have a disability contact and 1 has no contact information at all. Information will be sent to the general chair where no contact is available.

Several issues regarding disability swimmers and competitions were referred to me and I was able to secure answers to those questions. Then everything stopped..........

All events and activities beginning in March were postponed or cancelled. In July, Us Paralympic Swimming released a plan to return to training and preparing for the now postponed Olympic and Paralympic games. By mid-August each of those events were withdrawn. At this time there are no scheduled events confirmed.

The national disability committee and paralympic swimming have been meeting virtually this entire time. They have put on 3 virtual clinics for parents, swimmers and coaches. An official's clinic is planned for later this year. The alternate time standards for disability swimmers are being reviewed and adjusted, scholastic All-American standards were submitted for disability swimmers, and time standards above the sectionals level are being formulated.

The USOPC has consolidated staff services and updated the web sites. Disability information can be found at www.teamusa.org. Select sports, then summer, scroll down. Swimming and paraswimming are listed side-by-side. All updates will be posted here when they are available. I will push this information to the LSC contacts as well. If anyone would like to be added to this list send me an email and I will send it to you directly.

If there are any questions or information that I can assist with, please don't hesitate to contact me. I will find an answer or refer you to the person who has one.
