COMMENTS

Peru and Barbados opened today's last session of the competition to decide t-8 place. In the first quarter both teams went at each other at the offensive end. Quick goals for Peru on a penalty shot and Barbados on a quick 4 meter shot and from center forward to the crowd excited. Both teams were able to score goals from quick offensive attacks and extra man, leading to a 3-3 tie at the end of the quarter. Peru came out clicking on all cylinders in the second quarter at both ends of the pool. They closed in on their perimeter defense, not allowing any potential close to the goal shots, while counter attacking on every opportunity and getting either quick goals or extra man opportunities which, they were able to score. On this quarter Barbados could only score on a penalty shot, which led to an 8-4 Peru lead. The second half saw Peru continuing working hard on defense, which led to Barbados' turnovers and goals for Peru. At one point, Peru scored six goals in a row, opening the score to 14-5. From there on, Peru relied solely on their defense and played a slow-tempo game at the offensive side of the pool. With the victory Peru earns the seventh spot in the tournament. Rodriguez (#5) was their leading scorer with five goals. James (#2) led Barbados with two goals.

COMMENTS

Even though this game was for 5-6 place at this event, it would also decide who would be the fifth team from the zone to qualify for the World Championship. With that been said, Colombia and Puerto Rico knew they had to come out playing hard. Colombia was able to struck first wit goals from Center forward and 7 meters. Puerto Rico got an extra man opportunity which they capitalized. During the second quarter, Puerto Rico came out strong at both ends. Easy shots were not allowed by their defense and they were able to score twice from center forward Zayas (#7), from crisp cross passes and from extra man. Colombia's only goal of the quarter came with less than a minute to play in the quarter, which had Puerto Rico leading 5-4. Colombia tied the game on their first possession with a 7 meter shot. Puerto Rico countered with a perimeter shot from a counter attack. Once again Colombia used their good shooting to score from 6 meters. Goals were scored by both teams, Colombia on extra man and Puerto Rico from a counter. A goal from two meters for Puerto Rico put them ahead 8-7 to begin the fourth quarter. Both teams kept exchanging goals until Zayas (#7) scored two goals from center forward to seal the deal for Puerto Rico. With the win his team earns the rights to go to World Championships. Puerto Rico was led by Zayas (#7) with five goals. Colombia had a well-balanced attack, with four players scoring two goals apiece.

COMMENTS

The bronze medal game for the male category had Canada and Argentina do battle against each other. Canada scored quick from center forward and the perimeter to get a two goal lead. Both teams scored in the last minute to end the quarter 3-1 Canada ahead. Both teams were able to score at will in the second quarter. Canada's methodical inside 2 meter offense was good for four goals. Argentina got their goals from very quick movements in the 4 meter area and from extra man. The half ended with Canada up 7-6. Canada came out sizzling in the third quarter, scoring four goals, two from center, one counter attack and one extra man. At the same time, they locked up on defense, not allowing Argentina to develop any kind of consistent offense through the whole quarter. Argentina was able to get on the scoreboard at the six minute mark of the fourth quarter. Canada countered with two 2 meter shots in back to back possessions. From there on both teams pounded the ball inside, with Canada having more success in scoring than Argentina. With the win Canada earns the bronze medal. Djerkovic (#2) led the team with five goals. Argentina had three players scoring two goals

COMMENTS

The last game of the championships matched United States against Brazil. Both teams worked with lots of patience in offense while their defense dictated the tempo of the game. Both teams were able to score one goal. United Stated had two consecutive chances to score with less than 30 seconds left but Brazil's goalkeeper denied them twice. The first quarter ended in a 1-1 tie. At the start of the second quarter Brazil scored from seven meters, a goal that was countered by USA from the same distance. The next six minutes of the quarter was a very physical one at both sides of the pool. Neither team was able to penetrate the five meter area, with most of the shots either been highly contested or from more than seven meters out. The first half ended tied at one. The second half started as highly contested as the first one ended. Brazil was able to score when USA dropped back to help center forward. A breakaway penalty and an extra man goal for Brazil increased their lead to three goals. USA was able to penetrate the defense and score from three meters. With 2:30 left in the quarter Brazil scored on extra man to go up three goals. Brazil scored on their next two possessions, one from center forward and the other from five meters, to increase their lead to five goals. USA just kept fighting for a goal. But Brazil's goalkeeper kept denying them any goal. On their first possession of the last quarter USA was able to score on a six meter lob shot. Brazil looked happy just to run the clock in every possession, shooting from more that seven meters and getting back to defense. With 3:30 left, USA had a chance to score but missed a penalty shot. A minute later one more opportunity arose from extra man but still were not able to score. With 1:18 left USA scored from 4 meters, the last goal scored for the game. Once again Brazil had three players with two goals apiece. USA's top scorer was Kenney (#10) with three goals.
