COMMENTS

Canada continued their relentless attack in pursuit of the gold medal during the third session of the Junior Panamerican event. They were able to defeat Argentina by the score of 29-9. The game was close during the first quarter. Argentina surprised the Canadians with two quick goals from perimeter shots. Canada countered with an extra man and a center forward shot to tie the game. Two solid counter attacks produced Canada's next two goals. Both teams exchanged extra man goals to end the quarter with Canada up 5-3. The second quarter was all Canada. They just played intense defense and counter attacked on every possession. This allowed them to score 12 goals while only allowing Argentina two goals. Third and fourth quarter had the team from up north just keeping constant pressure full court while methodically scoring from all angles of the pool. They were solid on the extra man, 5 meter shooting and quick shots from center forward. Argentina never stopped playing hard, trying to decipher a strategy to score. They were able to do so from quick cross pass shots and extra man opportunities. Canada, who was led by Morrant (3) and Rojas (#7) with 5 goals, will play Puerto Rico during tomorrow's session. Argentina will face United States. They were led by Ianni (#5) with 4 goals.

COMMENTS

Both teams scored from extra man making the score 6-4 to start the last quarter of the game. Within the first minute of the quarter, USA scored on extra man to cut the lead 6-5. From there on, every team had their chances to score, specially on extra man but were not able to score. USA had a two man up situation in the last 15 seconds of the quarter but the last shot hit the goal post, assuring Brazil's victory. United States was led by Castro (#10) with three goals.
