COMMENTS

From the onset United States let Canada know that they would be in total control of the game at both ends of the pool. Once again, US showed a great deal of intensity and teamwork in the defensive end and a lot of patience and methodic work in the offensive side of the ball. Canada was able to get some good exclusions in the first quarter but wasn't able to capitalize. USA did score from both sides of the pool from the perimeter and from center post to get a 3-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. The second quarter saw both teams tighten up their defense, not allowing too many easy shots. Both teams were able to score on extra man, the only goals of the quarter. The second half was all USA. The americans just kept pounding the ball inside while at the same time increasing their defensive intensity. Goals from center forward, penalties and extra man were key on the offensive side for USA. With the win USA earns the top spot and Canada second place. COMMENTS

The second game of this session brought the teams from Brazil and Peru to go against each other. Brazil was able to score easily from counter attack, most of them coming from costly Peru turnovers. Brazil's defense didn't allow Peru to muster any effective offensive scheme. The first quarter ended with Brazil on top 3-0 and at halftime it was 7-1. Peru came out strong in the third quarter, scoring three goals for one for Brazil. Rodriguez (#11) was the key player in this quarter with two goals. COMMENTS

Argentina came out of the gate with all their intentions to keep their third place spot in the round robin preliminary round and play against Trinidad in the quarter final. They pounded the ball inside to center forward and scored the first three goals of the game. Trinidad had their chances to score on extra man but wasn't able to put the ball into the cage on two straight possessions. They did score from six meters out on a nice shot to the left of the goalkeeper. Argentina countered immediately with another center forward goal. Not to be outdone, Jordan (#5) put on some nice moves between three defenders and scored from two meters. The first quarter ended with Argentina ahead 7-2. Argentina increased their defensive intensity in the second quarter, not allowing a single goal while at the same time scoring five goals of their own to end the half ahead 12-2. The second half was more methodical for both teams. Neither team forced the ball in offense and were very careful not to allow easy goals. This half ended 7-4 in favor of Argentina. The team from the south was led by Agnesina (#9) with six goals. Beepat (#2) led Trinidad with two goals. Both teams will play again in the first game of the quarter finals in tomorrow's session.
