### **COMMENTS**

Peru and Trinidad and Tobago faced each other to decide 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> place in the UANA Youth Water Polo Championship. From the first minute it was clear that it was going to be a Rodriguez (#11) from Peru versus Trinidad. She scored the first two goals of the game and single handily carried her team throughout the game. Peru was able to hold Trinidad to one goal in each of the first two quarters, mainly by clogging the middle and not allowing any uncontested easy shots. The first half ended with Peru ahead 4-2. The decisive third quarter was all Peru needed to widen their lead and secure a victory. They scored five goals (Rodriguez scored four of them, mostly from inside two meters) for two from Trinidad to finish the third quarter ahead 10-4. Rodriguez committed her third major foul at the end of the third quarter, but the other Rodriguez (#2) took over and scored four goals in the last quarter. Peru's goalkeeper was on fire in that last quarter, stopping five probable goals for Trinidad. With the win Peru earns a fifth place spot ib the tournament.

### **COMMENTS**
