# **COMMENTS**

#### COMMENTS

In a battle between undefeated teams, USA came on top with a convincing 26-9 defeat of Colombia. The americans came out of the gate playing very strong at both ends of the pool. ## **COMMENTS**

The last game of the evening session was between the teams representing Canada and Bahamas. For the first quarter the game was as close as it can get.
