COMMENTS

The first game of the men's session was between the teams of Brazil and the host country Trinidad and Tobago. Brazil was looking to keep up the pace with three other teams (Argentina, Canada and Colombia) to decide who earns one of the top four spots in the preliminary round that automatically qualifies them for next year's World Youth Championships. They did that by scoring in more than 90% of their offensive possessions during the first three quarters of the game. The first two quarters Brazil attacked strongly from the center forward position and from relentless counter attacks. On the defensive side of the ball they went to a drop back defense, allowing Trinidad to take shots at the goal that were either blocked by the defenders or stopped by the goalkeeper. This strategy worked to perfection throughout the whole game, enabling Brazil to win by an ample margin and solidifying their hold on second place on the men's preliminary round. On offense three different players scored for Trinidad in this game. In less than 24 hours they have to play undefeated United States. Brazil, who has a tough game against Colombia during tomorrow's session, was led in scoring by Nardaci with 9 goals.

COMMENTS

Even when Bahamas could get an extra man opportunity, United States was able to clamp down on defense and not allow a good shot. This up-tempo game by the americans was good enough to increase their lead at halftime by 19-0. USA slowed down their ferocious attack, allowing Bahamas to get some close looks at goal but with no success. Sastre (#7) was able to score from a penalty shot for the lone Bahamas goal of the game. His team will take on Peru in tomorrow's session. Ocasio was USA's leading scorer for the day with five goals. His team will go against host Trinidad and Tobago in their next game.

COMMENTS

For Argentina, the last three days of competition will be their hardest ones. They will go against the three teams that are looking for the top spots and the automatic qualifying bid for the World Championships in 2020. This time they would go against a very solid Colombia team. On defense, Argentina started playing a zone defense, not allowing Colombia to pound the ball inside two meters to the center forward player, one of their strengths. In their first possession Argentina was able to get the ball to their post man, who was able to score from three meters and give his team a 1-0 lead. After a few slow tempo possessions, Colombia was able to get a turnover counter attack goal to tie the game at 1. Argentina immediately countered with a 5 meter shot to regain their lead. Two more center forward goals and one from extra man helped Argentina widen their lead to 5-1 Colombia had three consecutive extra man situations but weren't able to score once. The second quarter was a very slow tempo one for both teams. Once again Argentina scored from center forward and a counter attack from a Colombian turnover. With two minutes left Colombia was able to score a perimeter shot to cut the lead at halftime to 7-2. A solid drop back zone defense from Argentina was good enough to stop Colombia's power center forward attack. On offense Argentina went back to their strength, pounding the ball into the center forward and getting easy goals. They were able to score on extra man and from the perimeter to put the score 9-4 in Argentina's favor to start the last quarter. The last quarter started with one more center forward goal for Argentina. Colombia countered with a counter attack goal to cut the lead one more time. After that goal Colombia wasn't able to penetrate Argentina's defense and hold on to a 11-6 victory. With the win Argentina solidifies their chance for a medal. They were led by Giri (#3) with four goals. His team will a tough Canada team. Colombia will go against a tough Brazil team. They were led by Vallejo (#7) with three goals.
