In the first quarter both teams exchanged goals. Sastre (#7) scored from center forward twice and Peru from perimeter shots, ending in a 2-2 tie. Peru scored on a perimeter and a penalty shot to get a two goal lead. With 20 seconds left in the quarter Bahamas was able to score, cutting the lead to 4-3 at the end of the first half. During the second half, both teams came out playing strong at both ends of the pool. Peru was able to score first in the second half, just to have Bahamas scoring twice in consecutive possessions to tie the game. Both teams shot well from the perimeter and every time the ball got inside two meters they either got extra man situations or goals. With the score 7-6 starting the fourth quarter, Peru was able to score from six meters out and from center forward to put the game away. Rodriguez (#10) led Peru in scoring with five goals. His team earned the 7<sup>th</sup> spot with the win. Bahamas was led by Roberts (#3) with three goals.

#### COMMENTS

Colombia and host Trinidad and Tobago were the participants of the second game of the final round. The winner of the game would get 5<sup>th</sup> place and a possible spot in the 2020 World Youth Championships. Colombia came out sizzling from the beginning of the game. They were able to force turnovers and score from them. Within the first two minutes they had already scored three goals before Trinidad could score one from center forward. An extra man goal and a good perimeter shot for Colombia helped them increase their lead to 5-1 at the end of the first quarter. Both teams exchanged goals during the whole second quarter, bringing the fans out of their feet and cheering for the hometown team. The quarter ended 7-6, giving Colombia a good 12-7 lead at halftime. Both teams were very careful not to force turnovers and played solid defense in the third quarter. This one was won by Colombia 3-2. It was in the last quarter were Colombia just pushed the ball hard on offense and forced turnovers on defense, which led to many easy goals. With seven goals in the last quarter for two for Trinidad, Colombia was able to finish the game 22-11. Vallejo (#7) led a well-balanced attack with four goals. #### COMMENTS

The bronze medal game of this event was between the teams from Argentina and Canada. Canada scored first on an extra man situation. Argentina scored right back with a counter attack cross pass goal to tie the game at 1. Both missed open shot opportunities in the first quarter, not allowing either team to develop a strong offensive pattern. A good lob shot and a strong finish on a counter-attack helped Argentina to get a 3-1 lead. A good extra man shot cut the lead to 3-2 to end the quarter. In the second quarter, Canada started playing solid man to man defense, not allowing Argentina to use their bread and butter center forward attack. Knowing that, the team from South America started shooting from the perimeter with great success. Argentina went to their drop back zone, which allowed Canada to score from a six meter and from a counter attack to cut Argentina's lead to one goal. It was then when Argentina scored three consecutive goals to increase their lead at halftime 7-3. The third quarter was one with very few goals and very little action that led to exclusions. During the quarter there was only one exclusion and that was with 13 seconds left. Both teams scored two goals in the quarter, allowing Argentina to take a commanding 9-5 lead into the fourth quarter. The final quarter saw Argentina score from extra man, penalty, center forward goals, while at the same time not allowing Canada good shots. Their tight zone defense was very effective, stopping Canada. With the win Argentina gets the bronze medal. They were led in scoring by Setti (#7) with four goals. Todorovic (#8) led Canada in scoring with 2 goals.

## **COMMENTS**

United States and Brazil came to center stage for the final game of this Panamerican Youth Water Polo Championship. This game was a repeat from last year were Brazil came on top. USA was on top of their offensive game, scoring most of their goals from the perimeter. Brazil was able to penetrate USA defense for two goals, one from two meters and the other one from six meters out. The first quarter ended with USA ahead 4-2. The second quarter started with USA scoring on a penalty goal and from center forward to increase their lead to 6-2. USA countered with two consecutive extra man goal to increase their lead to 8-3. Brazil immediately countered with an extra man goal and one from the right side to get back in the game. Both teams scored on extra man in the last 90 seconds of the quarter. The score at halftime was 10-6 in favor of USA. The second half was just as exciting as the first one. USA scored quickly from six meters out. Two minutes later they got a goal from extra man, increasing the lead to 12-6. A counter attack goal after a very good defensive stint from USA was countered by a Brazil extra man goal with less than three minutes in the quarter. A penalty goal for USA and an extra man one for Brazil closed the third quarter 14-8. USA started the final quarter with two quick goals, increasing their lead to eight goals with six minutes left. Brazil turned the ball over in three different occasions, which did set up the tempo for the rest of the game. USA just kept playing their hard-style defense and relentless counter-attacks, With the win, USA wins the gold medal. Tierny (#2) led them in scoring with seven goals.
