### **COMMENTS**

Canada and Trinidad open the male tournament, From the start, Canada showed why they should be considered a medal contention team. They scored four goals in the first three minutes of the game, opening a lead that they would never relinquish. Trinidad used two miscues on defense by the Canadiens to score two goals of their own, but Canada countered with three goals to close the first quarter with a 7-3 lead. Stron defense and quick use of Trinidad's turnovers helped the north America team increase their lead to 13-4 at the end of the half. The second half was more of the same for both teams. Canada used all their players during the game but never slowed down their pace at both ends of the pool. Trinidad did play with heart and showed some good attacks that Canada had to work hard to contain. Canada was led by three players with four goals apiece. Robertson (#10) led Trinidad with two goals. During tomorrow's session, Canada will go against Bahamas and Trinidad will play Argentina

#### COMMENTS

It what could be considered a preview of a medal game for this event, Brazil and USA went at each other in a very exciting game. USA came out sizzling, scoring two goals in their first two possessions. Brazil didn't wait much time to counter and score four of their own. Most of the scoring was done from inside the five meters, from extra man and on penalty shots. The first quarter ended with Brazil on top 4-2. The second quarter was all USA. In less than 4 minutes they were able to score five goals, most of them coming from good counter attacks and solid extra man situations. In the last minute, Brazil was able to score one goal, with USA immediately countering with one of their own to end the half with US ahead 8-6. In the second half both teams kept playing strong defense, which led to guite a few turnovers by both teams but not many chances to score from them. Inside five meters USA was very productive, scoring from both sides of the field of play and from penalty shots. Their game from center post was key for them. The final quarter had both teams still playing good defense but not very solid consistent offense. The last guarter ended 2-1 in favor of USA. The Americans were led by Pulice (#7) with 5 goals, Brazil was led by Melges (#11) with four goals. USA plays Colombia and Brazil will go against Peru

# **COMMENTS**

The third game in the afternoon session was between South America counterparts Peru and Argentina. The "gauchos" came out playing with high emotions, scoring five consecutive goals on almost every possession they had in the first five minutes of the game, opening a lead that they would never look back to. It was not until there was one minute left that Peru was able to score to reduce the lead to 5-1 at the end of the first quarter. The second quarter was one of very little scoring. Both teams had their chances on extra man and from the perimeter but were not able to capitalize. Argentina scored with around four minutes left and Peru countered with a goal with about 2:45 left in the quarter for the only goals of the half. During the first minutes of the second half, Argentina started to play tougher defense, was able to score on a penalty and counter attack shots, increasing their lead to 11-4 at the end of the third quarter. Peru tried to counter with two consecutive goals with less than four minutes of the game, but Argentina was able to control the tempo of the game and finish with a victory. Peru vas led in scoring by Rodriguez (#9) with five goals, while Fraletta (#6) and Setti (#7) led Argentina with three goals apiece. In tomorrow's session, Peru has to go against nemesis Brazil while Argentina will go against host Trinidad and Tobago.

#### COMMENTS

The last game of the first day of competition brought the teams from Bahamas and Colombia to the field of play. From the beginning of the first quarter, Colombia demonstrated that they are a team to be taken into consideration when talking about medal round. They exploited Bahamas weaknesses both in defense and in offense, jumping to a 5-1 lead to end the first quarter and a 13-2 lead at halftime. Colombia's center forward play, tough defense and precise counter attacks were just what they showed during the whole game. Their opportunistic attacks allowed them to wortk as a cohesive unit. Bahamas never stopped playing hard. During the last quarter they showed that they could compete with the best teams, scoring from inside five meters in three of the five opportunities they had in the last three minutes of the game. Bahamas was led by Sastre (#7) with four goals. Vallejo (#7) for Colombia was their top scorer with five goals. Bahamas will play another tough team in Canada while Colombia will have to prove how tough they are when they go against USA during tomorrow's session
