COMMENTS

Canada and Argentina went to battle for the bronze medal of the UANA Water Polo Cup. Canada was able to score from a penalty shot after Argentina missed an opportunity of their own. Canada added a second penalty goal and a two meter shot with Argentina scoring on a penalty shot. Canada scored quickly from the perimeter to increase their lead. Argentina countered with an extra man and a perimeter shot to cut the lead to one goal. Canada score from a 5 meter shot and a cross pass to increase their lead 6-3. The third quarter was back and forth for both teams. Argentina could only score on a penalty shot while Canada's only goal came on an extra man opportunity with three minutes left in the quarter. Canada came out sizzling during the fourth quarter, scoring two quick goals and increasing their lead to six goals. Argentina closed the gap by scoring two extra man goals but Canada was able to hold the lead. Canada was led in scoring by Boyd (#5) and Garduan (#11) with 2 goals. COMMENTS

The gold medal was, as expected, a closely contested one decided on penalties. United States came out strong in offense and precise in defense, not allowing Brazil too many opportunities and scoring. During the phase, Brazil scored in their first chance but USA wasn't able to score on their chance. The second chance was an exact replica of the first one. Brazil was able to score and USA just couldn't score. Brazil missed their third shot while USA was able to break the ice and score. With everything on the line, Countinho put a dagger on USA's chance by scoring the decisive goal. United States had Bowen (#9) with 3 goals. Leyvas (#6) and Guimaraes (#11) led Brazil with 3 goals.
