# **Competitors and Age**

Competitors who will be representing their countries must meet the following requirements:

- Demonstrate their age with proof such as what is seen on the birth certificate or Passport.
- The competitor must be a citizen, whether through birth or naturalization, of the country being represented, according to the GR-2.5 Rule of FINA.



Junior Divers are divers defined as per FINA age groups.

Group A: 16, 17 and 18 years old Group B: 14 and 15 years old Group C: 12 and 13 years old Group D: 11 years old or less

Age is determined as of December 31, 2021.

## **Team Delegation**

Each UANA Federation will be allowed to enter 2 divers in each individual event and one team in each synchronized event.

## **Minimum Country Participation**

For the events of the different categories to be recognized as "Championship", there must be competitors from at least two (2) different countries. If there is not at least two (2) countries participating in an event, the organizing committee shall advise the President of UANA of the elimination of such event no later than July 30, 2021.

## **Technical Meeting**

The technical meeting will take place at [place] on [date], at [time]. The meeting will be open to everyone with appropriate accreditation for the event. Athletes must attend in order to validate their participation in the events.

The technical delegate will lead the meeting, which will be conducted in English and, if required, in Spanish.

# **Clothing and Equipment**

Clothing and equipment used by athletes and other participants in the Championships must comply with the documents listed in the FINA General Rules available at <a href="mailto:fina.org">fina.org</a>.

#### Weather

In early to mid October, the temperature in Tucson typically ranges from 63°F to 88°F and is rarely below 55°F or above 97°F. The coolest time of the day is from 11:30 PM to 8:00 AM, and the warmest time of the day is from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM. The day has gained half its heat by 9:15 AM and lost it again by 8:30 PM.

The diving well is held at a constant temperature of 84° F



#### **Awards**

First, Second and Third place awards will be given for each event.

High point awards will be given for men and women

Team Awards will be given for first, second and third place teams: combined, men, and women.

Points scored will be awarded in the following order:

## **Technical Equipment**

Colorado Timing Systems will be used to score all events. DiveMeets will serve as the meet management system for this event

#### Rules

The diving program will be carried out according to the rules and exceptions of FINA for Age Groups (FINA Diving Rules available at fina.org.

All the competitions will be final. In case there are more than twelve (12) competitors in a determined event, the dives with a limit in the degree of difficulty will be carried out in a session separate to the one of dives without degree of difficulty limit.

The FINA age group rules will be applied to the "A", "B" and "C" groups without exceptions. For the participants in the "D" group, the following rules will apply:

## Boys and Girls Group D 3 metre springboard and 5 metre platform

The competition shall comprise six (6) different dives: four dives, voluntarily selected from four different groups with a total degree of difficulty not higher than 7.6 and two dives without degree of difficulty limit from two different groups.

## Boys and Girls Group D 1 metre springboard

The competition shall comprise of six (6) different dives: four dives, voluntarily selected from four different groups with a total degree of difficulty not higher than 7.0 and two dives without degree of difficulty limit from two different groups.

# **Anti-Doping**

During the competition, anti-doping control tests may be conducted, according to the control rules established by FINA.

#### **Protests**

Protests will be resolved under FINA Rule GR 9.2.

Protests must be submitted to the Chief Referee in writing by the team leader, with a deposit of US\$100, within 30 minutes following the conclusion of the respective event. All protests will be considered by the Chief Referee.

The commission (made up of the following persons present at the respective event [insert applicable roles]) will consider appeals against decisions by the Chief Referee and give recommendations to the jury of appeal, whose decision will be final.

# Jury of Appeal

The Jury of Appeal shall be composed of the UANA Executive Committee Members, any UANA Honorary Members present at the Championships, and if in attendance, the FINA delegate to the event with the UANA President or in her absence a Vice President, as Chair. Each member shall have one vote, except as provided hereunder, and in case of equality of voting, the Chair has a casting vote. Jury members may attend and participate in the appeal by way of video conference where feasible.



A jury member is allowed to speak, but not to vote, on a case in which the interest of his own Federation is a party. A jury member having acted as an official in the competition under appeal is allowed to speak but not vote. In case of urgency, the jury may vote on a matter even if it has not been possible to call all the members. The decision of the jury is final.

The decision of the jury will be final.

## **Technical Officials and Judges**

Technical officials will be appointed as needed to meet the requirements set out under the FINA Diving Rules 2017-2021.

#### Costs

All fees are paid per participant in U.S. dollars (\$). All fees must be paid prior to your arrival in Tucson. Please contact <a href="mailto:events@jteammgt.com">events@jteammgt.com</a> to setup a payment.

#### **Entry Fees**

Entry fees cover the cost of lodging, ground transportation (to-from airport & to-from event venue), and 3 meals per day. Fees are paid per person based on how many other individuals that person will be sharing a hotel room with.

- Single Occupancy (1 bed): \$225/person per day
- Double Occupancy (2 beds): \$185/person per day
- Triple Occupancy (2 beds): \$150/person per day
- Quad Occupancy (2 beds): \$120/person per day

#### **Sanction Fee**

Sanction fees are a flat rate of \$40 per participant.

#### Hotel

Official Hotel: Marriott Tucson University Park

All delegations and event staff will be housed in the Marriot Tucson University Park, 880 East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Tucson, AZ 85719. The hotel is a short 10-minute walk from the competition venue and is also minutes away from numerous restaurants and a shopping mall. The Graduate Tucson is right across the street and could be booked for anyone traveling to the event who is not included in a delegation.



Hotels must be booked on or before September 10, 2021 to receive the competition rate secured for the Championships. The competition rate is limited to official travel party only. Please note that double, triple, and quad occupancy rooms each have only two beds.

A fee of \$300 per person will be applied to those who do not wish to use the official hotel of the championships; local transportation and meals will not be provided.
