

Northwoods Figure Skating Club 31th Annual Festival on Ice

"Movie Magic...Lights, Camera, Skate"

NFSC's annual ice show is our celebration event where all of our skaters, from Learn to Skate to Freestyle levels, are given the opportunity to showcase and perform the skating skills they have learned and accomplished throughout the year. We strongly encourage all skaters' participation in this event.

When: Saturday, March 21st 2020 at 1:00 p.m. & 6:00 p.m.

Sunday, March 22nd 2020 at 1:00 p.m.

Where: Rice Lake Hockey Arena, Rice Lake WI

Cost: \$100 (includes: participation in group number, coaching fees, choreography, music, ice fees, t-shirt,

participation medal, costume, 1 pair of tights, professional picture in show program, and access to

professional action photos of show performances with free downloads)

Due Date: Registrations are due November 24th in Rice Lake, Nov 25th in Cumberland. You must pay your show

registration ONLINE and bring the attached forms and the remainder of your show money via check

form on the due date listed with each rink. Cancellations after December 1st will result in a \$50 non-refundable deposit.

Checks for the remainder of the show will be cashed after Jan 15th, 2020.

LATE REGISTRATIONS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.

Feature Performances: \$50. For skaters Freeskate 1 and above. Skater must be in Freeskate 1 at the time of

registration. Payment is due in full at time of registration. Costumes are not included. Feature skaters are required to participate in a group number. See attached for more

information.

Skating Requirements: Skaters must skate the 2 skating sessions prior to the start of show practices with

NFSC during the 2019-2020 season. Freestyle skaters must skate with NFSC for

minimum of 10 hours during current season prior to start of show practices.

ALL Show practices are mandatory for all skaters.

Volunteer Requirements: Each skater must have a representative volunteer for <u>2 committees</u>. We suggest one

committee selection to be prior to the show and the other to be during a show

performance. Please see attached for more information.

Pictures: Professional photography will be offered. We ask that ALL skaters attend, as these photos will be used in the show program. Photo purchases are optional. Tentative date is February 2nd, 2020 at the Rice Lake Middle School. Please reserve this date. We will have a show date for pictures tentatively scheduled for Sun Feb 9th in the event we need to cancel on Feb 2nd. This is in no means a secondary date, you must still come on Feb

2nd unless the entire picture date is cancelled. More information to follow as we approach this date.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Who may participate in the ice show?

Any member of the Northwoods Figure Skating Club who meets the skating requirements as described above.

How is my skater placed in a group number?

Skaters are grouped based on the USFS skating level that (s)he has attained at the time of registration. It may be necessary to place skaters from more than one level together in each group. Every effort is made to place skaters from the same rink together, however, this is not always possible.





Should we need to reorder their costume, there will be a \$20 restocking fee. Tights are subject to availablitiy.







Get the Perfect Fit

Follow these simple tips when you're ready to take body measurements.

- Have your dancers wear undergarments or a lightweight leotard with a bra that gives the bust line its typical shape for most accurate measurements.
- Have your dancer stand straight with their weight evenly distributed.
- The measurement tape should be snug but not too tight on circumference measurements and stretched tight for vertical measurements.

Getting the Measurements:

- Bust/Chest Measure over the fullest part of your chest with your arms relaxed at your sides.
- Waist Measure around where your waist naturally indents. Keep your finger between the tape and your belly.
- Hips Measure around the fullest part of the hips and buttocks while standing with your heels together.
- Girth Measure from the midpoint on the shoulder towards the front, through the crotch and back around to meet the midpoint of the shoulder.
- Inseam Measure from the crotch to the bottom. The inseam length is the number of inches, to the nearest half-inch.

The size charts can be found on each product page on the Size Chart tab.

To determine sizing for shoes, please refer to each specific product detail page.

Each shoe has its own sizing and fitting suggestions.

Because sizing and cut will vary between brands, please use our size charts as a general guide. If you are between sizes and need assistance selecting a size, please see the product reviews located on each style or contact customer service.

Costumes:

Features are responsible for selecting and paying for their own costumes. It is important to select and order costumes timely to ensure their arrival and proper fit prior to pictures in early February. Discuss this with your group. It is suggested to order costumes in December.

Music & Choreography:

A coach will be assigned to each feature group. Feature skaters are responsible for providing their coach with a copy of their music. The cost of cutting your music, choreography, and coaching are not included in the registration fee. Features will be given scheduled ice practices; however, you may elect to practice more often outside of NFSC. This is the responsibility of the skaters to coordinate with their coaches

Volunteer Positions

Each family is required to work a minimum of <u>2 different committees</u> during the show session. One of these job requirements should be fulfilled prior to the ice show and the other during or after show performances. Positions to choose from are listed and described below. For those working during a show performance (does not include dress rehearsal), admission to that show performance is free. The Chairperson of each committee will contact each worker to coordinate shifts and better explain the duties of each position. The annual ice show takes many volunteers to be successful. You may be asked to assist on a different committee as needed. Your help is greatly appreciated!

DECORATIONS: This committee is responsible for selecting, preparing, and setting up the decorations and taking

down all decorations after the last show performance. There may be an opportunity to fulfill this

position while skaters practice during the ice show session.

BLACK PLASTIC: Black plastic is put up during dress rehearsal and taken down after the last show performance.

PHOTOGRAPHY: Assist photographer during photo shoot, getting them ready to line up, help with posing of

skaters, and/or help distribute pictures when completed.

CLEAN UP: clean locker rooms, prepare them for our use, and clean up after final show. Sweep and remove

trash in bleacher area during dress rehearsal, between shows, and after final show performance.

CHECK-IN: Check-in skaters during show practices, night of dress rehearsal, and prior to each show

performance. Check-in volunteers working during show performances and hand out nametags

provided.

PROPS: Creativity needed! Work with committee chair for props to be created and used during show

performances. Obtain previous props from storage shed if necessary. Set up during shows as

needed. Coaches may want to use props during photo shoot.

FLOWERS: Sell flowers before and during show performances in lobby and arena. Wrapping of flowers will

also be necessary during dress rehearsal. This position will also collect DVD orders during

shows.

TICKET SALES: Sell tickets in the lobby 1 ½ hours prior to performances. Collect tickets and stamp hands upon

admission.

PROGRAM SALES: Sell programs before and during show performances in lobby and arena. This position will also

assist with collecting DVD orders during shows.

SPOTLIGHTS: Run spotlights during dress rehearsal and during each of the show performances. These

volunteers will get into all shows free of charge. You will get to see the show at the best spot!

USHERS: Assist audience into bleacher area, assist handicap and elderly individuals to the reserved

seating areas; keep audience members seated during skating performances, monitor crowd.

MUSIC/SOUND: Play music during show session practices at the rink. This is a very important piece for show

practices, they need the music. This is a great opportunity for a parent there watching practice

anyway. This person(s) would likely need to be available for a few hours at a time.

LOCKER ROOMS: Locker room supervision is required of all NFSC skaters during dress rehearsal and during show

performances. Locker room monitors will make sure skaters are safe while in the locker rooms, assist with needs, account for the skaters' whereabouts, and help skaters get to the ice for their performances on time. You must be safe sport compliant. Further information and training on

this position will be provided.
