ICE SHOW SOLO SELECTION PROCESS

10 Solos per show

Each skater is responsible for recording and handing in the Solo/Feature form before the deadline. The solo/feature form **must** be handed in before the deadline of December 1 to be considered. If no form is handed in, no points will be awarded and the skater will not be considered for a solo.

Eligibility

- **Forms are due December 1, 2023.** This will allow the soloist time to order costumes if needed.
- Skater must have passed Freeskate 1 prior to Nov 1 to be eligible for a solo, other than for skaters in their senior year of high school for which there is no skating level requirement.

Competition Points - 4 types of competition (individual only)

- Basic Skills Competitions – 5 points for each event entered (**Max. of three events**)
- Basic Skills Series – 5 points for placing overall in the top 3 in your level
- Badger State Games / Non-basic skills competition / Invitationals – 10 points for each event entered (**Max. of three events**)
- State Games of America- 15 points for every event entered (**Max. of three events**)
- National / Sectional / Regional Competitions – 20 points per event entered (**Max. of three events**)

Tie Breaker - In the event of a tie between two or more skaters, ranking will be based on:

- 1- Years in the club
- 2- Age
- 3- Number of 1st place competition finishes during that time frame
- 4- Past solos
- 5- Board discretion

Establishment of Picking Order for a Feature:

1st – Senior solo applicants who declined a solo and wish to have a feature instead.

2nd – Highest skate level within the club

3rd - Points achieved

4th - Number of years in the club

5th - Skater's age

Picking Format:

- Number and type of features will be determined by the ice show committee under the direction of the Board of Directors.
- Order of skaters will be created based on the above Picking Order guidelines.
- 1st skater will be able to select who he/she would like to skate with.
- The process will move to the next skater on the list and repeat until all feature spots are full.
- Feature music will be issued to each feature group by the ice show committee.
- Once picking order and music selections are established by the ice show committee/board, they will be considered FINAL.
