FACILITY	• Facility: Campbell County School District (CCSD) Aquatic Center • Address: 800 E. Warlow Dr, Gillette, WY 82716 • Ten (10) lane, indoor, 50-meter pool, equipped with non-turbulent lane markers, starting blocks, & backstroke flags. Water depth measured at a distance of 3' 3-1/2" (1 meter) to 16'5" (15 meters) from both the start and end walls ranges from 3'6" to 13'. Dive starts are not allowed from the turn end at any time. • Colorado GEN7 Timing System, with 10 lane scoreboard with fully automatic timing, a semi-automatic backup, and two (2) manual timers per lane. • Lanes 1-8 will be used for competition. Lane 10 will be open for continuous warm-up/warm down with Lane 9 open as a buffer. • The host will ensure the required course dimensions.
FORMAT:	• <u>8 & Under:</u> All events will be Timed Finals. • This meet is a mixture of timed finals and prelims/finals events. See the Event list for further details. • Individual events will be swum by designated age groups: 8 & Under, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16, 17-18, 19 & Over. The 400 IM, 400, 800 and 1500 freestyles will swim combined ages. See the Event list for further details. • The following events will be competed fastest to slowest, alternating girls and boys. The fastest 8 girls and the fastest 8 boys in each of these events will be seeded to swim at finals. Swimmers in the events below must report to the Resolution Desk prior to the scratch deadline the day before the event is competed to indicate their preference for a prelim or final swim.

	○ 9-12 400 Freestyle ○ 13 & Over 400 IM ○ 13 & Over 400 Freestyle ○ 13 & Over 800 Freestyle ○ 13 & Over 1500 Freestyle ● Swimmers in the prelim sessions of the 400, 800 and 1500 Freestyles must provide their own timers. ● Swimmers in the 800 and 1500 Freestyles must provide their own counters. ● Mixed Relays will be competed 12 & Under, 13 & Over. ● Single gender relays will be competed 8 & Under, 10 & Under, 12 & Under, 13-14, 15-16 and Open. ● The Meet Referee reserves the right to combine events and heats of differing age, gender, distance and/or stroke per section 102.7.2. ● 50-yard events will start from the start-end and be timed in the same fashion as all other events. Non-conforming times will be seeded LCM, SCM, SCY. ● Bonus Swims will be seeded last by course.
COURSE	● Long Course Meters
ELIGIBILITY	● All swimmers must have achieved at least one WYSI qualifying standard or be included in the entry file as a relay-only swimmer. ● All swimmers must be USA Swimming registered members as per Article 302. ● Age is determined by the age of the swimmer on the first day of the meet, July 18, 2025. ● Any swimmer entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. ● Coaches must be registered and in good standing before the start of the meet. ● <i>In the event entry(ies) are submitted for a swimmer for the Championship meet who is not in good standing or has an ineligible time, the entering club will have 24 hours to correct the issue. If not corrected in 24 hours, a \$50 fine shall be payable to WYSI.</i> ● Deck registrations will NOT be accepted.
DISABILITY SWIMMERS	● Athletes with a disability are welcome and shall provide advance notice of the desired accommodations to the Meet Director. ● The athlete (or the athlete's coach) is also responsible for notifying the Deck Referee of any disability prior to the competition. ● Swimmers with disabilities are not required to meet the time standards for their age group events; however, they must provide a time for each event they enter. ● Classification of a swimmer with a disability is irrelevant. ● In accordance with USA Swimming rule 202.4.14 & Article 105 the Meet Referee has the authority to accommodate swimmers with disabilities and make appropriate accommodations as exclusively determined by him/her. ● Such swimmers may enter up to three (3) events in total for the meet, not including relays. For swimmers 12 & under each event must be 100 meters or less and for swimmers 13 & over events must be 200 meters or less. There will be no special or separate scoring.
CUT PROTOCOL	● If the timeline is excessive after entries are received, the following cut protocols may be used in any order deemed necessary. ○ 13 & Over 50s of stroke (backstroke, breaststroke, or butterfly) will be cut. ○ Other bonus events will be cut. ○ Relay events will be cut.

QUALIFYING TIMES	• Entry times for WYSI Summer Long Course Championships must be in the SWIMS database and achieved on or after June 19, 2024. • High School or College times within the same time period will be accepted as qualifying times in all events. • Proof of time must be provided with the entry. Failure to do so will prevent the swimmer from swimming in the event. • Times reconciliation will be done. Times missing from reconciliation will require the coach to provide proof of time or the swimmer's event entry will be scratched.
ENTRIES	• Electronic entries should be emailed as an attachment to the entry chairperson. • ALL ENTRIES MUST BE EMAILED TO office@WyomingSwimming.org by July 9, 2025. • Email MUST include: 1. Either a zip file or sd3 file 2. A pdf of Proof of Time by Athlete. Do NOT convert times 3. Names of all relay-only swimmers 4. Name and email/cell phone # for one coach on deck at the meet responsible for the swimmers in the entry file <u>PAYMENT MUST BE RECEIVED prior to athletes entering the water.</u> If payment has not been received, payment shall be made on deck by check or PayPal/Credit Card on deck with a 5% convenience fee. • One check per club for payment and made payable to WYSI. • Include \$25.00 WYSI participation fee and \$1 Outreach Fund Support payment for all swimmers, including relay-only swimmers. • All athletes, including relay-only swimmers, must be included in the entry file prior to the entry deadline. Please remember, Team Unify will not export athletes entered in the meet with no events or relay legs selected for the swimmer. • Mail payment to: Matt Olsen, PO Box 4398, Gillette, WY 82717-4398 • Entries will be acknowledged within 48 hours if they are accepted into the meet. Your entry is considered received only if you receive an acknowledgement. • Deck entries will not be accepted. • All swimmers (except 8 & Unders) may enter and swim no more than three (3) individual events per day for a total of seven (7) individual events and no more than one (1) relay event per day. 8 & Under swimmers have a total of six (6) individual events (three on Friday and three on Saturday) and may swim in one (1) relay per day.
BONUS EVENTS	• NTs are not accepted. Athletes MUST have a time based on the eligibility criteria achieved during the qualifying period to participate in the bonus event or must have been achieved at a high school or college meet during the qualifying period. • PLEASE MARK BONUS EVENTS IN YOUR ENTRY - One Qualifying Time = 2 Bonus Events - Two Qualifying Times = 1 Bonus Events - Three or more Qualifying Times = 0 Bonus Events • For swimmers 12 & Under each bonus swim shall not exceed 100 yards in length, and for swimmers 13 & Over each bonus swim shall not exceed 200 yards in length. • <i>In addition to the bonus event structure listed above, any swimmer 13 & Over who qualifies for at least one individual event will be permitted to enter and swim in up to two additional 50s of stroke (backstroke, breaststroke, or butterfly). A swimmer cannot compete in more than three (3) individual events per day (including bonus events, 50s of stroke, and time trials) for a total of seven (7) individual events (not including time trials) during the meet. There will be no qualifying standard for the 50s of stroke (backstroke, breaststroke, or butterfly). Athletes must enter at their fastest eligible 100 of stroke time from within the qualifying period.</i>
RELAYS	• Each team may enter one relay team per relay event.

	• Athletes may only compete in relays of their designated age group. • The names of the participants in the actual relay events do not need to be designated in the entry file though may be designated if desired. • All relays must submit relay cards by the start of each respective relay event. Changes are permitted until the heat is closed. • Mixed relays shall consist of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes. • Unattached swimmers may not compete on relays. • The second and fourth legs of the 200-meter relays will start in the water. If an official lead-off split is desired, please follow the legal split instructions.
TIME TRIALS	• Time trials will be offered at the discretion of the Meet Referee. • Athletes are limited to two (2) time trials during the course of the meet. • On days when time trials are offered all requests MUST be made by 10:00 AM MDT at the Resolution Desk. • Time trials will be offered after preliminary sessions. • Further information will be provided at the General Meeting on Sunday, July 13, 2025, at 6 PM MDT. • A swimmer requesting a time trial must be a participant in the Championship meet in at least one event for which they have a WYSI Summer qualifying time. Relay-only swimmers are not eligible to swim time trials. • Time trials count in the per day event limit, but do not count towards the total meet limit. • If the time trial would cause the athlete to exceed the per day event limit, the swimmer must scratch a Championship meet event by the scratch deadline to be eligible to enter the time trial. • Time Trial swimmers must provide their own timers and counters. • No awards will be presented.
FEES	• Individual Event Fee: \$12/event • Relays: \$18/relay • Time Trials: \$15/trial • Swimmer Participation Fee: \$25.00 per swimmer • WYSI Outreach Fund Support: \$1.00 per swimmer • Outreach Swimmers Subsidized Entry Fee: \$10 for the meet (contact the entry chair for details)
SCRATCH PROCEDURE	• Preliminaries and Timed Finals All preliminary and timed final event scratches for Friday, July 18, 2025, must be e-mailed to the Admin Referee by 6:00 PM MDT, Thursday July 17, 2025. All preliminary and timed final event scratches for the remainder of the meet must be submitted to the Resolution Desk (scratch box will be on the table) by 6:00 PM MDT the evening before the event. The only option after the deadline is a Declared False Start, and the DFS will count towards the daily event limit. A swimmer in an individual event who fails to compete in said event without scratching or declaring a false start shall be required to complete positive check in with the start area Chief Judge at least 15 minutes prior to any remaining events the swimmer may have for that day. Failure to check in may result in the swimmer being disqualified from the remainder of their events for the meet. • Finals (continuation of prelims) The names of swimmers qualifying for a final race, along with the alternate qualifiers, shall be announced by public address. Swimmers will have thirty (30) minutes from the time of the announcement to notify the Resolution Desk to declare their intention to scratch. Their final decision must be declared within thirty (30) minutes following their last individual preliminary event. A swimmer in an individual event who fails to compete in said final shall be barred from further competition for the remainder of the meet, unless the swimmer has been excused by the Meet Referee due to illness, injury, or circumstances beyond the control of the swimmer. A declared false start under 101.1.3E or deliberate delay of meet under 101.1.5 is not permitted and will be regarded as a failure to compete. In the event of withdrawal or removal of a swimmer from competition, the Deck Referee shall fill the final, when possible, with the next qualified swimmer(s). The alternates shall not be penalized if unavailable to compete in the finals.

	● Declared False Starts Declared false starts (submitted to the Deck Referee and/or start area Chief Judge during the session) in accordance with rule 101.1.3E will be allowed during preliminaries and timed finals ONLY. Such swims will count toward the daily and meet event limits. ● Please note that relay teams must follow these same scratch and DFS procedures.																																																			
PROGRAMS	● No programs provided. Heat sheets will be free per session and a QR Code will be posted for digital copies.																																																			
MEET MOBILE	● MEET MOBILE: Meet Mobile will be functional for this meet (dependent upon satisfactory internet access) All users should be aware that Meet Mobile publishes unverified raw data that may not always be accurate.																																																			
WARM-UP	● Warm-up schedules and lane assignments will be emailed out once the entries have been received and a detailed explanation will be given at the general meeting on Sunday, July 13, 2025, at 6 PM MDT. ● Warm-up procedures shall follow WYSI Policy III.H.4 ● The Meet Safety Committee shall consist of the Meet Referee, Meet Director and the Host Club Safety Coordinator acting as the Meet Safety Director. This committee shall prepare and implement an action plan to ensure safety is considered during warm-up sessions and swimming competition. The committee shall review the warm-up procedures with the coaches and marshals monitoring the warm-up sessions. ● Coaches shall supervise their swimmers throughout the pre-meet warm-up session. Coaches must remain on deck during the warm-up periods of their swimmers.																																																			
AWARDS	● Individual Events: Medals 1st-8th, Ribbons 9th-16th ● Relay Events: Medals 1st-4th, Ribbons 5th-8th ● Award distribution procedures will be discussed during the General Meeting on Sunday, July 13, 2025, at 6:00 PM MDT. Procedures will be announced and posted on deck and around the spectator areas. ● WYSI and/or GST will not mail leftover awards. Please designate someone from your team to stay and pick up awards. ● High Point: High point awards for the top scoring male and female in each age group will be awarded by WYSI. ● Team Awards: Custom awards to be given to the top three teams in each division. Divisions will be determined once all entries are submitted and the total number of splashes per team is identified. Teams will be evenly divided into 3 divisions: Large, Medium, and Small. ● Team Spirit: The David Schmitt Award shall be given to the club exhibiting superior team spirit, sportsmanship, and behavior as determined by a vote of the clubs competing at the meet. Each club shall have one vote, cast by an athlete member of the club. Votes will be due immediately following the completion of morning warm-ups on Sunday, July 20th. Please deliver your team’s ballot to the Resolution Desk.

TIMERS	● Clubs will be assigned lanes for timing proportionate to the number of swimmers they have entered. ● After receipt of a club’s entries, the Meet Director shall notify clubs as to the lane and session assignments for timers from their club. All timers must attend the timers meeting to be held 20 minutes prior to the start of the meet. ● Prelim swimmers in the 800 and 1500 freestyle must provide their own timers and counters.																																																			
LEGAL SPLITS	● Any individual wishing a split time in any event shall submit a request to the Resolution Desk at least 30 minutes in advance and shall provide an additional 3 timers for the race.																																																			

SWIMWEAR	● Per USA Swimming rules (102.8.1.F), 12 & Under swimmers may not wear a Technical Suit at any Sanctioned, Approved, or Observed meet. The age of the swimmer is determined on the first day of the meet. Guidance on identifying compliant and non-compliant suits can be found on the USA Swimming website under Tech Suit Restriction for 12-and-Under Swimmers. Coaches may request further confirmation from the Meet Referee or his designee by presenting the suit prior to the commencement of the session. Suits on the body of the swimmer will not be given consideration.
RULES	● The current USA Swimming Rules and Regulations including the Minor Athlete Abuse Protection Policy will govern this meet. ● Operation of a drone or any other flying apparatus is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present without written USA Swimming approval. ● Use of audio or visual recording devices, including cell phones, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms. In addition, photography and videography behind the blocks is <u>not permitted</u>. ● Deck Changing is PROHIBITED.
SAFETY	● No shaving is permitted at the competition site. ● No glass containers are permitted within the facility. ● A first aid station is located on deck by the elevated bleacher location. ● An AED is located on deck at the center podium. ● No lifeguards are on duty, but all GST coaches are fully certified lifeguards. ● The nearest hospital is located at 501 South Burma Avenue, Gillette, WY 82716.
SAFE SPORT	● The USA Swimming Safe Sport program is USA Swimming's comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations. ● The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (www.usaswimming.org/maapp) prohibits Adult Participants (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult participant. Adult Participants are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet. ● Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member's responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. A report to the U.S. Center for SafeSport may be made via telephone at 833-5US-SAFE (833-587-7233) or online at www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern. Various state laws may also require reporting to law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency ● All adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy ("MAAPP"), and that they understand that compliance with MAAPP is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition ● For information on how to report other alleged violations, including without limitation, the USA Swimming Code of Conduct and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, please visit www.usaswimming.org/report. ● All athletes age 18, or who turn 18 during the meet, must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing by the first day of the meet. A member not in good standing will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or during the meet, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay. ● All U.S. athletes, coaches, and staff expecting to receive a deck pass should be prepared to show proof of current USA Swimming membership. Coaches must meet and have current

	certifications for all the requirements of coach membership including successfully passing the required background check and APT course.
FACILITY RULES	• NO SMOKING OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS ARE ALLOWED IN THE AQUATIC CENTER OR ON THE AQUATIC CENTER GROUNDS. This includes, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, electronic cigarettes, and vapor pens.
CLARIFICATIONS & PROTESTS	• Any request for clarification of a judgement decision must be addressed with the Deck Referee connected to the inquiry. As per USA Swimming Rule 102.22, protests against the judgement decisions of starters, stroke, turn, place and relay take-off judges can only be considered by the Referee and Referee's decision shall be final.
MEET JURY	• The Meet Jury shall consist of not fewer than three (3) and not more than five (5) persons, at least one of whom shall be a coach and one an athlete. When possible, the members shall be from separate teams. The Meet Jury will decide all issues of eligibility, and anything not addressed in the Meet Announcement. The Meet Referee shall have authority as described in the current USA Swimming Rulebook.
CHANGES TO THE MEET	• Once a meet is sanctioned, changes can be made to the meet invitation before the meet, only with the approval of the Sanction Chair. Any change to the meet format after the meet begins will be at the discretion of the Meet Referee and communicated to coaches.
WEATHER/ FACILITY PROTOCOL	• If weather or facility conditions make it impossible to follow the original timeline of events, the Meet Director and Meet Referee have a right to make changes to the meet sessions. The Meet Director will notify the teams of the changes with as much notice as possible. Cancellation of the meet, or a session, is the decision of the Meet Director, Meet Referee and the Meet Jury.
DECK ACCESS	• Only current USA Swimming registered athletes, coaches, officials, and official meet staff are permitted on the pool deck. All non-athletes on the pool deck must produce proof of their valid USA Swimming Membership Card in the USA Swimming App (no photos or screenshots) when asked by the Meet Referee and/or his designees.
OFFICIALS	• Each WYSI team shall provide official(s) to work the meet based on the number of swimmers entered into the meet: ○ 1-9 Swimmers – No official required, ○ 10-17 Swimmers – One official, ○ 18-25 Swimmers – Two officials, ○ 26 or more Swimmers – Three officials. • Each WYSI team shall provide the names of the official(s) who will be representing their team at the meet at the time their entries are submitted. If a club does not have sufficient officials to meet this requirement, please notify the Meet Referee immediately. Wyoming Swimming Policy & Procedure Section III, Paragraph D will be enforced. • There will be a meeting at 7:00 AM prior to the start of Fridays' prelim session, and then 45 minutes before the start of each subsequent session in the patio area adjacent to the weight room. This will be a National Officials Qualifying Meet (OQM). The following positions are eligible for evaluation: N2 and N2 Recertification: ST, DR, CJ and, SR. N3 and N3 Recertification: ST. If you are interested in applying, please fill out the JotForm link below. A minimum of four (4) sessions must be worked during the meet for evaluation. Preference for assigned position may be given to those requesting evaluation and to those actively working on national certifications. • Uniforms will be a white Polo shirt tucked in with a black belt, black shorts, skirts, or slacks, with black closed toe shoes. No denim please. The uniform will be the same for prelims and finals. • To help with planning purposes all officials who plan on officiating and those that would like to be evaluated for National Certification should complete the application HERE

GENERAL	• There will be a General Meeting on Sunday, July 13 at 6:00 PM MDT. Attendance is required by at least 1 Coach per team and it is recommended that at least 1 other team representative attends as well, so that information can be shared with the team. Register for the Zoom Meeting HERE • GST will be providing hospitality for Meet Staff, Officials, and Coaches only. • Information on any concessions will be provided at the General Meeting. • Coaches and representatives who are not in attendance are responsible for obtaining the information covered in the General Meeting.
WAIVERS	• “It is understood and agreed that USA Swimming, Wyoming Swimming, Gillette Swim Team and the Campbell County School District shall be free from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the event.”
