Bob McDowell

- Present to communicate YMCA initiatives and goals to WPAC board.
- His time spent with WPAC is best reflected in an email exchange prior to meeting in which President Bernadette Hess had given him questions posed by the WPAC as seen here:

Questions from WPAC

1. Relationship between Riverbrook YMCA and Wilton Wahoos Wahoo parents are very grateful for the dedication and care our coaches give to our swimmers every day. Can we briefly explain the relationship between the Y and the Wahoos? - common goals, boundaries, communication, finances, budget, swim meet support shared etc...Is there anything we can do to strengthen the relationship between the Wahoos and the Y?

The Wilton Y Wahoo Competitive Swim Team Program is a YMCA Program. All participants in the program are members of the YMCA. The Coaches are employees of the YMCA.

Common Goals: Youth Development, Healthy Living and Social Responsibility are the overarching goals of our YMCA and are baked into the program. We want to provide a healthy, safe and effective competitive swim program where children can thrive in a competitive environment socially, emotionally and physically. Our organization is large, serving nearly 8,000 different people each year. We are Cause driven nonprofit 501C3 organization and look to enhance the quality of life for all that are

involved. People are not denied access to our programs based on their ability to pay. Annually, we collectively raise more dollars than any other no-profit in Wilton to support our many programs and other specialty programs that are completely subsidized such as Race4Chase and Swim Access which serve nearly 600 different children. Many of our special need's programs are subsidized as we serve nearly 150 different children and adults with a variety of special needs.

Boundaries: Not sure exactly how to answer this one?

Communication: I believe that all the squads have communication via email on a regular basis specific to the program from their Coaches. Each registered Y member also receives updates regarding the overall YMCA updates. We also, have a social media presence.

Finances: At this point the finances for the program are ok although we are spending more than we are bringing in. Wahoo enrollment has declined over the past several years. The market as far as competitive swim teams with 50-meter pools to train in has changed in the past 8 years [Greenwich, Chelsea Piers, Velo-CT [Swim Seventy], and the Regional Y of Western CT along with the Westport Weston Y moving to within 4.5 miles of us]. We now enroll 275 versus 330 5 years ago. Although the enrollment has declined, we have been able to maintain our FT Coaching structure. We are a program that has always prided itself in having the best coaches and parental support.

Budget: The calendar year budget for the program is analyzed on a monthly basis by the management staff which includes our CFO, CEO and Randy. The budget is formulated on an annual basis. The revenue to

support the overall program budget is secured from program fees, meet revenue and other registration fees. Overhead [indirect] and membership allocations are also set within the budget. Pricing for the ensuing years is analyzed from a market standpoint and the overall needs of the program.

Swim Meet Support: As we all know meets require a lot of coordination as the Y is open for programs and services thus the needs for parking attendants, increased cleaning services, front desk staffing, etc. If more help is needed please let Randy know.

Is there anything that we can do to strengthen the relationship between the participants/parents and the Y? Adding Greg to attend WPAC meetings will give everyone a better understanding of the overall Y and the Capital Campaign/Funding/Needs. We recognize that operating a large youth sports program is dependent on volunteer time and we could do a much better job of recognizing the efforts of the volunteers. There can be an opportunity to have the WPAC coordinate with our Development Director in terms of helping with the next phase of the Capital Campaign. A specific need would be to help raise funds for a new bulkhead. Tax deductible Contributions can be spread over a 5-year period. A new bulkhead is estimated to cost \$200k.

2. Capital Expenditures

What is the timeline and budget for pool maintenance/repairs and equipment replacement? Specifically,

- Bulk head Currently being considered for repair/replacement by August 2019 [Cost estimate is in the range \$200k range for replacement] [\$75k for repair]
- Bubble New Bubble will be installed by October 2019 [Cost estimate is \$300k includes new lighting and air handling system] [Will use \$150k that is in the bubble fund]
- Blowers and Air Heater New Air Handling System will be installed by October 2019
- New Pool Filtration System and Pool Water Heat Exchanger will be installed by September of 2019 [Cost of \$100k]
- Please note that other facility enhancements will include a safer parking lot, new fitness room, an additional fitness program studio a new 25 yard locker room and an enlarged lobby space

along with many infra-structure replacements and upgrades.

3. Health & Safety

What is the Y doing to ensure air-quality under the bubble is at acceptable levels? Are there studies being done regularly? Is there some kind of alarming system that alerts the staff that levels in the pool (chemical/temperature) are not acceptable?

Air quality is an issue especially when we go through an adjustment period after we go from outdoor swimming to indoor swimming and sometimes after we host high volume swim meets. The chemical balance of the water is monitored at least 2 times daily along with water temperature. If a system fails ...water, air, or chemicals staff is immediately authorized to contact the maintenance team who will then assess the situation and make the appropriate decisions to adjust the system or contact our Pool Contractor for repair of the system.

Air testing was completed with results showing that the air inside the bubble is normal when compared to the Control Area which is the Outside. There are some areas that were swabbed on the surface of the bubble and are in the process of being cleaned/removed but none of these areas are affecting the air quality. Further testing will be done following the cleaning. Randy has reported to me that the air quality has been fantastic.

4. Wahoo Coaches Responsibilities

Can you outline the expectations for our coaches?

Coaches are employees of the YMCA. Currently we employee 5 full time staff that work within this program with Randy being the overall Senior Director of all Aquatic Programming and staff for OUR YMCA. Randy has the 4 other FT Coaches and Samantha Lusher our Aquatic Director as direct reports along with Jo Ann. He is responsible for ensuring that each of his direct reports adhere to their agreed to job descriptions and that their performance is measured on a regular basis. Randy ultimately has the responsibility for the overall pool schedules and works with our Maintenance Staff to insure the cleanliness and overall safety of the Aquatic Areas and other adjacent areas that Aquatic Programming participants use [i.e. locker rooms].

Coach Todd: equipment purchases for dryland and meets; meet set up of facility; organization of team meet travel. Coach Alex manages Caitlin and entire age group program. Interfaces with Samantha regarding schedules in both pools. Finance Committee. Meet set up of timing and computer system. Coach Joe: organization of Breast Cancer fundraiser; team meet travel as directed by me; Masters; Safety Committee. Assists with all groups as needed. Coach Caitlin responsible for Super Bronze and Super Squad; assists Alex with Maroon and Gold; additional administrative duties as deemed by Alex and Randy. Does computer meet set up. Coach Joann is primarily Office Manager but also currently assists Caitlin and as needed in emergencies for all other groups. Samantha, oversees and teaches Aquatics, manages lifeguards puts up pool schedules for both 25 and 50 pools.

Specifically, we are wondering why the Wahoo coaches are lifeguarding during our practice times? We have had on few occasions over the past month had a situation where several of our coaches have rotated into a guard position during a practice session. We have been forced to do this due to a shortage of lifeguard personnel. This shortage of qualified personnel is something that I as a 40-year Y director have never experienced. We have been promoting into the marketplace that we have Lifeguard positions available since late August and we do have several qualified applicants in the pipeline which will help close the gap of the shortage. I have been assured that our YMCA Wahoo Swimmers are being trained appropriately and guarded. Randy has reported to me that when coaches have been in the stand, they were not slated to be coaching at that time: the swimmers still had the usual coaching coverage.

How long will this continue? Hopefully, we have reached a point that we have secured enough guards that this will not occur in the future. Is there a plan to communicate this to parents? Randy reported to me that he has answered questions after parents observed us in guarding. We also sent out an email to members about the situation.

Why aren't the Wahoos responsible for the pre-competitive team? Would

this be a change to consider in the future? Randy is ultimately responsible for the Bronze Program and has been since its inception about 8 years ago. Randy is working to better connect the group with the overall competitive side of the program.

5. Renovation

When will the renovation begin and what impact will it have on the Wahoos? What is the long-term plan especially regarding (both Y and Wahoos)?

Renovation of the Building at this point is scheduled to begin in March of 2019 and conclude by the end of September 2019. The Bubble will need to come off by mid-April in order to have the new bubble and mechanical blower system installed by early Oct of 2019. The late spring and summer home meets can be conducted. The Timing Display Board for the North Pool will be permanently moved from North Wall [that wall will be rebuilt with new windows] to the East Wall. The Olympic Trial Plaques and Team Record Boards will be shifted on the same wall. At this point during a portion of the construction period [Mid-April to Late Sept] part of the pool deck [partial west and south edges] will be used as a pathway to a temporary entrance/exit to the building that will be located in the rear of the building but will not disrupt the use of the 50-meter pool for training or meets.

At this point the 25-yard pool will be closed from March through mid-summer. During the March through May period the Bronze Program will be modified and will need to be scheduled into the 50-meter pool. The schedules will be determined.
