YMCA National Short Course Championship News

Stay current on updates regarding the 2023 YMCA National Short Course Championship by visiting the meet page regularly.

- <u>Travel Assistance Application</u> is open. Deadline is March 24, but coaches of athletes seeking assistance are encouraged to apply early.
- Adolph Kiefer YMCA Youth Character Award Application is open. Deadline is March 1. Open to
 graduating seniors who have been a YMCA swimmer for at least five years and are competing in the
 YMCA National Short Course Championship Meet this year.
- <u>Coach of the Year</u> nominations are accepted through March 20. Direct link <u>here</u>. The award is presented at the YMCA National Short Course Championship Meet but the recipient is not required to attend the meet.
- <u>Senior Recognition</u> submissions are being accepted until March 15. These will be featured on the video board at the meet. Include athlete's name, YMCA, plans after graduation and photo.
- A Moment of Remembrance will be observed at the meet to recognize those from our YMCA Swimming family who have passed away since March 2022. Submit names and connection to YMCA Swimming to Bob McDowell.

YMCA National Championships – Did You Know?

In 1971, the Central Branch YMCA team from Cedar Rapids, Iowa won its second YMCA National Championship in as many years. The team, coached by Jim Gilchrist, won only one individual event – Bruce Rollins in the 100 Freestyle – and one relay – 400 Freestyle Relay – but their depth carried them to the national championship. Many of the men from that team reunite every year at the YMCA National Masters Meet, representing their hometown YMCA in Iowa. They call themselves the Over-The-Hill-Gang (OTHG) and create a special shirt for each year's meet. The relationships they built over fifty years ago have lasted ever since and they are proud to call themselves YMCA swimmers and teammates to this day.
